



Know what's below. Call before you dig.

April is National Safe Digging Month, reminding residents in Sunrise and across the U.S. to call 811 two full business days before any digging project.

When homeowners and contractors in Florida call 811, they're connected to Sunshine 811, which notifies the appropriate utility companies of the intent to dig. Professional locators are then sent to the requested dig site — at no cost to the property owner — to mark the approximate locations of underground lines with flags, paint or both.

Striking a single line can cause injury, repair costs, fines and inconvenient outages. Every digging project, no matter how large or small, warrants a call to 811. Installing a mailbox or swing set, building a deck, and planting a tree or garden are all examples of digging projects that should only begin a few days after a call to 811.

Solid Waste and Recycling Guidelines

In 2017, the City of Sunrise launched several enhancements to residents' garbage service:

- Green, 95-gallon rolling carts were distributed to homes to facilitate automated trash collection.
- Bulk trash collection began taking place weekly instead of monthly.

In order to help keep your neighborhood looking neat, please note the following guidelines:

- All garbage must be placed inside the 95-gallon cart for collection. Items should not exceed the rim of the garbage cart with the lid closed.
- Maximum weight of cart with contents should not exceed 300 lbs.
- Yard waste - such as trimmings and small branches - must be placed in the 95-gallon cart for collection. Larger items will only be accepted during bulk trash collection.
- Loose items will not be collected.
- Hazardous materials, Contractor generated waste, Biomedical waste, tires and electronics will not be accepted.
- All garbage should be placed curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the scheduled pick-up day, but no earlier than 7:00 p.m. the previous evening.
- Carts must be placed with the arrows pointing to the street to allow for the smooth collection of cart contents.
- **Carts MUST be removed from the curb and stored out of sight once they've been emptied.**

Recycling at home

Thanks to our single-stream system, you can combine all household recyclable materials in your blue rolling cart, including:

- Newspapers, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, office paper, soft-cover books, and file folders.
 - Shipping boxes and other clean cardboard containers (such as dry cereal boxes) – flattened, folded or cut to fit inside the cart.
 - Plastic containers (narrow-neck only) such as milk, juice, water, detergent, and shampoo bottles.
 - Glass food and beverage containers.
 - Aluminum and steel food and beverage containers.
- Please empty and rinse containers. (Any caps should be removed and disposed of in the trash.) Recyclables should be empty, clean and dry. Do not place recyclables in plastic bags, place them loose directly into your cart.

We cannot accept the following items for recycling:

- Plastic bags* or plastic wrap.
- Paint, pesticides, electronics, or other household hazardous waste (HHW). Please visit sunrisefl.gov/hhw for information about the City's HHW disposal options.
- Styrofoam* containers, pizza boxes, or carbon paper.
- Prescription or over-the-counter medications. These may be disposed of safely at the drop box in the lobby of the Sunrise Public Safety Building (10440 West Sunrise Boulevard).
