Our City Commission is proud to live in and represent a City where children and education are top priorities. Sunrise embraces the philosophy that “it takes a village to raise a child” – along with the role our entire community plays in student success. Research from the National Education Association shows that when schools, parents, families, and communities work together to support learning, students tend to earn higher grades, attend school more regularly, stay in school longer, and enroll in higher-level programs.

The Sunrise City Commission and staff recognize strong schools help build strong neighborhoods. That’s why we’re committed to supporting the educational initiatives, schools, teachers and families so vital to Sunrise – and do so in tangible ways with real impact:


- Sunrise recognizes and rewards each month a **K-12 Teacher of the Month** at City Commission meetings, alongside our great police officers, firefighter-paramedics and employees. By celebrating great teachers, the City Commission recognizes that while we do not participate in the curriculum or educational process directly, we rely on the spirit these teachers represent to have a resilient and dynamic community.

- Sunrise took a lead role in incorporating chess in the curriculum of public elementary schools countywide, through the expansion of a successful Sunrise pilot program. Our **community-based and scholastic chess initiatives** have resulted in many accolades. Sunrise was selected as 2015 Chess City of the Year by the United States Chess Federation; named one of the 2015 “Most Livable” Cities in America by the U.S. Conference of Mayors; earned the 2016 Education Partnership Award from the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance; and been the topic of articles in national publications about chess and education.
- Sunrise partnered with Family Central to become the nation’s first **Community of Quality Early Learning and Literacy**. C-QuELL has helped preschools in Sunrise better prepare our children for elementary school, and led to community-wide conversations about the importance of early learning opportunities. As part of that program, Sunrise initiated a Parent Leadership Training Institute, intended to help parents develop their own powerful voices as advocates for their children in education and the community.
- Sunrise facilitates an award-winning, hands-on civics program for high school students – the **Sunrise Leadership Academy** – founded in 2009.
- Sunrise created the **Sunrise Reads** program, which places volunteer reading coaches in select second grade classrooms.
- Sunrise offers **camps and one-day programs** to help keep students active and engaged during their time away from school.
- Sunrise, for more than a decade, has provided a dedicated full-time **School Resource Officer (SRO)** for each public elementary, middle and high school in Sunrise. We recognize that the SRO program is important for the well-being of our students, families, and schools, and we continue to stand by its school safety and mentoring benefits.
- Sunrise hosts an annual **Back to School Round-Up** to celebrate the start of the new school year. This community party brings schools and families together in a fun and relaxing environment.
- Sunrise offers **scholarships** on a competitive basis to two graduating Sunrise high school seniors each year to help them follow their dreams.
- Sunrise City Commission members and City staff regularly meet with schools, attend functions, and strategize about how the City can play **a more substantial scholastic role**.

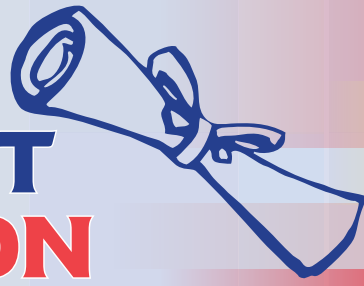

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

School Resource Officers

For many years, the City of Sunrise has maintained a full-time School Resource Officer (SRO) in every one of its public schools – serving students at all grade levels. SROs are a part of the integrated educational team that protects, guides, mentors and molds Sunrise children.

Each SRO is a certified law enforcement officer who undergoes specialized screening and training to serve in our schools. SROs offer educational support in the fight against drugs, crime and bullying, and they help promote positive relationships between students and Police professionals. The presence of a full-time SRO provides a deterrent to those who may think about wrongfully entering school grounds.

Teachers of the Month

The City of Sunrise knows how important great teachers are to building great schools and great neighborhoods. Each month during the academic year the City honors its top teachers, selected to represent each public elementary, middle, and high school. Teachers of the Month are recognized at City Commission meetings alongside the City's Employee of the Month, Police Officer of the Month and Firefighter of the Month honorees, and are presented with certificates and gift cards.

Education Advisory Board

Sunrise has a 12-person board, comprised of residents appointed by the City Commission, which serves in an advisory capacity in matters pertaining to education. Each member acts as the City's liaison to a Sunrise public school to facilitate the exchange of information.

Back to School Round-Up

The City's annual Back to School Round-Up gives Sunrise residents an opportunity to celebrate the end of summer and gear up for the start of classes. Parents and children have access to representatives from the City's public schools, and can ask questions and gather information in an informal setting. The first 1,000 Sunrise K-12 students (with proof of residency) receive an age-appropriate book and a drawstring backpack filled with school supplies. The event also features games, crafts, music, and free refreshments.



STUDENT ENRICHMENT

Sunrise Leadership Academy

The Sunrise Leadership Academy (SLA) is a hands-on, real-world civics program for students. SLA participants are selected by their teachers and administrators to represent Piper, Western, and Plantation high schools.

SLA sessions are held once a month during the academic year, and each SLA class completes a service-learning project in partnership with local organizations and businesses. This award-winning program has been recognized by the Florida League of Cities and the U.S. Conference of Mayors. For more information about the SLA, call (954) 747-4662.

Outstanding Citizenship Scholarships

The City's annual Outstanding Citizenship Scholarship Award Program provides a pair of two-year scholarships (60 credit hours) applicable at most Florida colleges. The program is open to graduating high school seniors who are residents of Sunrise and meet income requirements and other guidelines. Applications are available online each spring, and through high school BRACE advisors. For more information, call (954) 747-4600.

Sunrise Reads

Through the Sunrise Reads program, retired baby boomers work with second grade students to foster a love of reading and improve literacy skills. Sunrise Reads volunteers visit partner elementary schools throughout the academic year and participate in reading, tutoring, and book-related activities. School-Break Programs

The City of Sunrise Leisure Services Department offers fun and enriching activities for students during breaks in the school year. Programs include Kids' Days Off (held on teacher work days and select school holidays), Mini Camps (one- or two-week sessions during spring, summer and winter breaks), and a seven-week Summer Camp. For most programs, participants are grouped by age: children 5 to 10, and teens 11 to 15. For more information, call (954) 747-4600.

Broward Reads

Sunrise is proud to be a Broward Reads City – part of a collaborative countywide initiative. Broward Reads focuses on four critical areas – including school readiness, chronic absenteeism, family engagement, and preventing summer learning loss – to ensure children are learning at grade level.

Summer Story Times

When school is out, children in grades K-2 are invited to participate in free, weekly story times at the Village Civic Center. Light refreshments are served, and each child takes home a free book. For more information, call (954) 578-3551.

FOCUS ON: Scholastic and Community Chess

Chess in the educational environment has been a popular topic among researchers – many of whom report a strong correlation between learning to play chess and academic achievement. Just as importantly, chess has benefits outside the classroom: It enhances a city's economic development opportunities by increasing academic achievement and job readiness; fosters understanding by breaking down cultural barriers; and improves socialization by providing a means of interaction for people of all ages.

Since 2011, the City of Sunrise has collaborated with a wide range of partners, from schools to businesses, to promote the benefits of chess in the academic environment and in the community.

Highlights include:

Chess in the Classroom. During the 2013-2014 academic year, Sunrise spearheaded a “First Move” pilot program that provided chess instruction as part of the school curriculum for second and third graders at Village Elementary, Banyan Elementary and Discovery Elementary. Thanks to this successful collaboration between the School Board of Broward County, the America's Foundation for Chess “First Move” program, and the City of Sunrise Police Department – as well as the advocacy of Sunrise Mayor Michael J. Ryan and the overwhelming support of administrators, faculty, parents and students – Broward County Public Schools adopted a district-wide chess instruction program beginning in 2014-2015.

Mayors' Chess Challenges. Mayors' Chess Challenges are hosted on a rotating basis by cities throughout Broward County. These free and friendly meet-ups bring together elected officials, community leaders, students, families and chess players of all ages and abilities to support and celebrate scholastic and community-based chess programs. Sunrise Center for Excellence in Chess. Recognizing the potential for continued growth in chess programming and the economic, social, cultural, and educational benefits it offers, Sunrise partnered with the National Scholastic Chess Foundation to create the Sunrise Center for Excellence in Chess. The Center, founded in 2016, represents the City's sustained commitment to chess and reinforces Sunrise's position at the epicenter of community-wide scholastic chess in the United States. The Center serves as a central clearinghouse for best practices in chess instruction, developing new and assisting existing programs, creating events, and offering training across the City. Open-Play Chess. The City hosts free, supervised Open-Play Chess sessions twice each week: Saturdays from 10:00 a.m. to noon in the lobby of the Sunrise Civic Center Theatre (10610 West Oakland Park Boulevard, 954-746-3207), and Tuesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the Village Multipurpose Center Gym (2240 NW 68th Avenue, 954-578-3551). People of all ages and skill levels are invited to participate, and free instruction is provided by the Sunrise Center for Excellence in Chess.

Student Tournaments. In 2012, the City began hosting an annual “Champions of Chess” tournament for students in Sunrise elementary, middle, and high schools. In 2017, the Sunrise Center for Excellence in Chess became the tournament's facilitator and introduced a Sunrise-specific rating system for participants. Participation is free, and tournament champs in each division take home a prize. For more information, visit www.sunrisechesscenter.org.



National and Regional Recognition. Our chess initiative has been recognized for excellence by two prominent national organizations. In 2015, Sunrise earned the prestigious title of Chess City of the Year from the United States Chess Federation. That same year, the U.S. Conference of Mayors named Sunrise one of “Most Livable” Cities in America on the strength of its scholastic and community-based chess programs. And in 2016, Sunrise received the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance's Education Partnership Award – a significant endorsement of chess in Sunrise as an economic and workforce development tool.

FOCUS ON: Youth Self-Expression

Through its **Word Up! Youth Poetry Initiative**, the City of Sunrise strives to expose teens to the proven benefits of arts programming – including increased academic achievement, communication skills, creativity, cognition, commitment, empathy, leadership, tolerance and self-confidence. Our high-quality programs include:

Lyrical Lounge. The City's bi-monthly open mic nights offer a creative outlet for poets, musicians, and other talented teens. Each Lyrical Lounge takes place in the Civic Center Art Gallery – transformed for the occasion with a stage and IKEA furnishings – and is presented in collaboration with the Jason Taylor Foundation's Omari Hardwick blueapple Poetry Network. Admission is free and light refreshments are served. For a list of upcoming dates, visit www.sunrisefl.gov/lyrical.

Word Up! Poetry Slam. Sunrise's annual poetry slam for high school students launched in 2009. Poets are selected through a competitive audition process, and participate in a series of free workshops to prepare them for the final stage. Word Up! showcases some of Broward County's most talented spoken-word artists, and inspires audience members of all ages. Visit www.sunrisefl.gov/wordup for information.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day Writing Workshop. In honor of Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Sunrise hosts a creative and intensive writing workshop that integrates the literary arts and civic responsibility. FOCUS ON: Social Services

The Sunrise Leisure Services Department has a full-time social worker who assists residents in need in a variety of meaningful ways. The City's social services for families include:

Information and Referral. Our social worker can connect families with local agencies for assistance regarding Social Security, Medicaid, healthcare (including mental health), employment, food stamps, and more.

Crisis Closet. The City maintains a small pantry with non-perishable food items that's accessible to eligible residents in time of emergency. Durable medical equipment – such as wheelchairs and walkers – is also available for loan.

Fee Waivers. The City offers a limited number of fee waivers for designated athletic and camp programs, allowing qualified disadvantaged youth to participate. Eligibility is based on current Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Prescription Discount Card Program. Sunrise residents who are without health insurance or a traditional pharmacy benefit plan – or who have prescriptions not covered by insurance – can take advantage of this discount program. Enrollment is free, and there are no income or age requirements.

Special Programs. Our social worker coordinates a variety of special programs for underprivileged Sunrise families, including Thanksgiving Baskets and Holiday Baskets with traditional meal ingredients, and a children's holiday party. These efforts are supported by donations from City staff, as well as local businesses and organizations.

Pre-GEM Enriched Mathematics

Banyan's pre-GEM (Great Explorations in Mathematics) curriculum is offered to fourth- and fifth-grade high achievers based on teacher recommendation. Students who meet the program's criteria by earning a Level 4 or 5 on the Florida State Standards Test in Math benefit from exposure to an accelerated curriculum in mathematics. The goal is for each child to be eligible for the GEM program in middle school, setting the tone for long-term success in mathematics and in life.

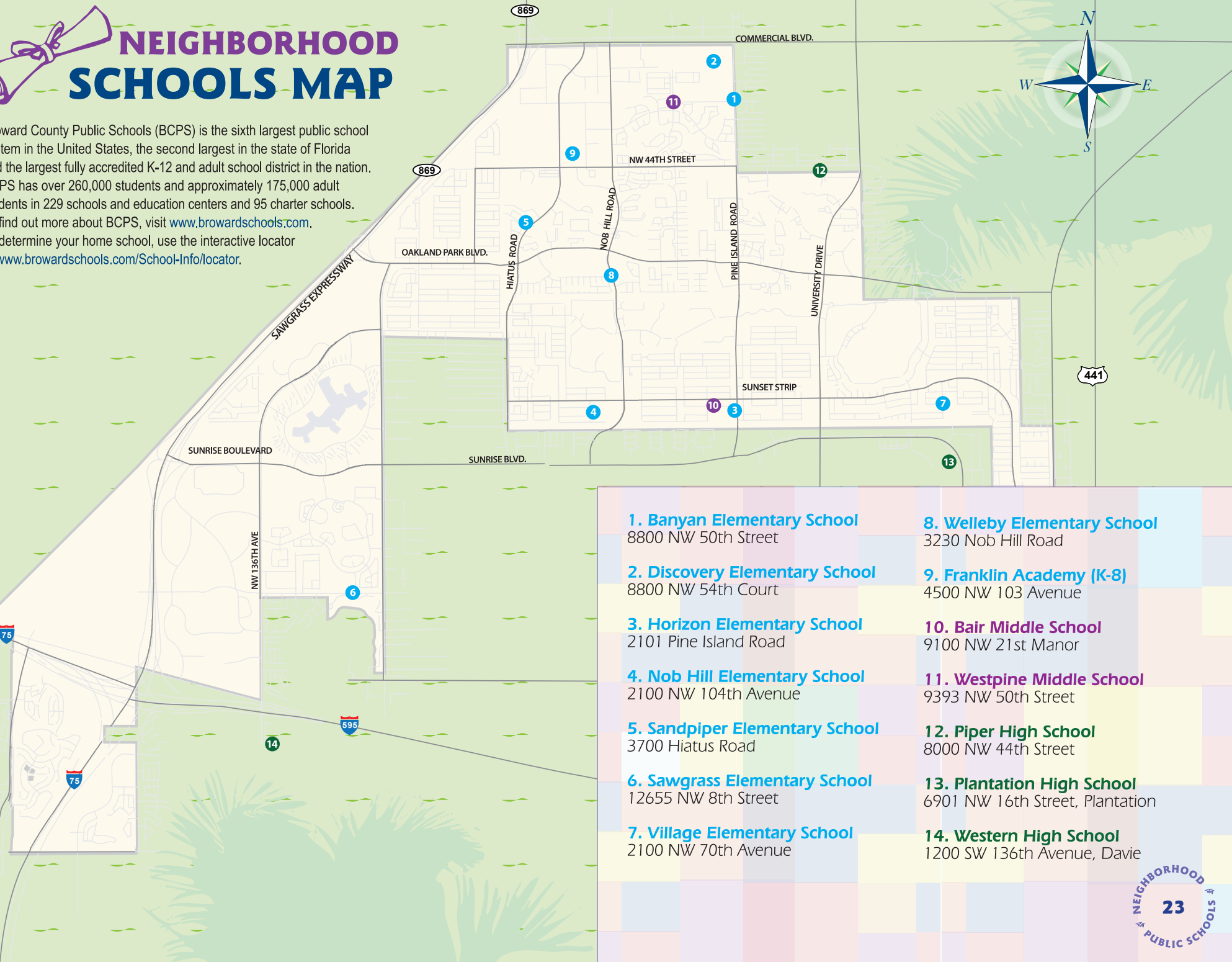

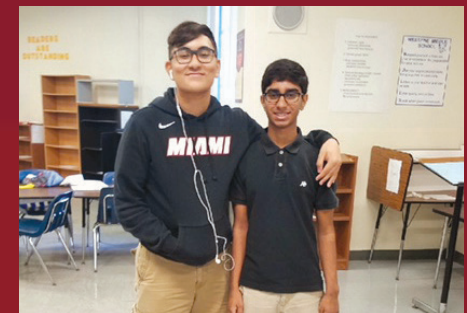

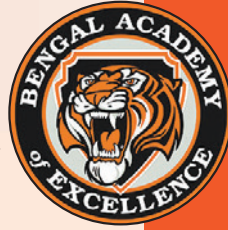
