Expand the Senior Center to accommodate new and enhanced programming.

- 2 Renovate City Park to provide multi-use green space, new recreation amenities, and indoor program areas.
- Expand Welleby Park to add a dog park, a "Safety Town" play-learn area and a lakeside boardwalk.
- Renovate **Flamingo Park** to add indoor meeting and program space, shaded basketball courts, fitness stations, and a second batting cage.
- Improve Nob Hill Soccer Club by creating a shared-use playground for Nob Hill Elementary (school hours) and neighborhood families (after school and weekends), creating a tot lot for young children, and boosting soccer usage by transitioning two fields to synthetic turf.
- Partner with **Horizon Elementary** and **Bair Middle** to create a playground and athletic amenities for school and neighborhood use.
- Improve Roarke Hall facilities.
- Convert a small 12th Street right-of-way into a usable neighborhood green space.
- 9 Expand the Civic Center to provide additional basketball courts, fitness amenities and program space. Campus improvements may also include a new, shaded playground, and Amphitheater upgrades.
- 10 Renovate and expand Oscar Wind Park to include a multi-purpose buildingand gymnasium, a new playground, and dedicated parking.
- Convert vacant and underutilized land including parcels at 9525 West Oakland Park Blvd., and Sunset Strip/109th Avenue to attractive green space.

On Election Day — November 4, 2014 — there will be a local bond referendum on the ballot: Sunrise voters will have the opportunity to consider approving up to \$65 million in general obligation (GO) bonds to help meet residents' changing recreation needs.

If the referendum passes, the bonds would fund significant improvements to Sunrise parks and recreation facilities — improvements designed to benefit people and neighborhoods across the City. With bond funding, Sunrise hopes to:

- Expand the 44th Street Park to nearly 17 acres to allow for the construction of walking trails, pavilions and a nature center.
- Acquire land at Commercial Boulevard/Nob Hill Road and adjacent to Sunrise Athletic Complex (SAC) to construct new athletic fields and related amonities
- Make yet-to-be determined improvements to existing neighborhood parks.
- 15 Site of future park/recreation amenity.
- 16 Passive park scheduled to open Summer 2015.

We'll also explore opportunities to create a Water Park and construct a Performing Arts Center.
