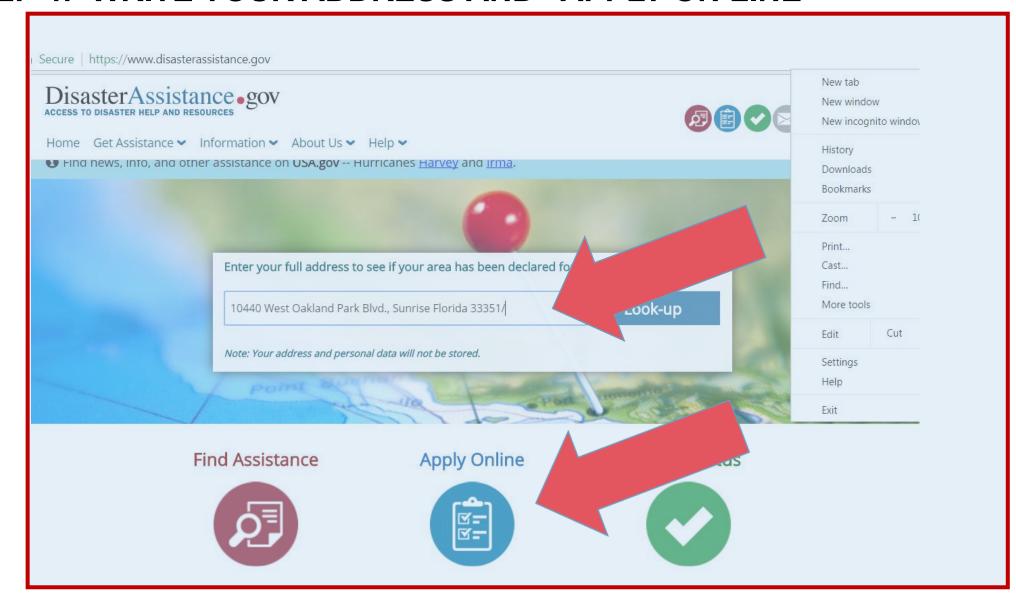

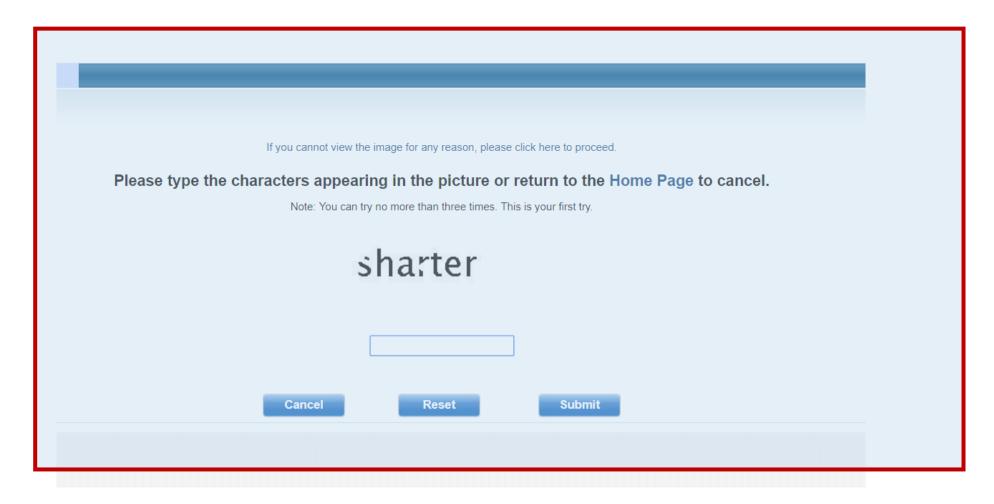
Visit <u>DisasterAssistance.gov</u> to assistance online. If you experience difficulty applying online, you may also call (800) 621-3362 / TTY (800) 402-7585 to apply during standard hours of operation (7 a.m. to 11 p.m. Eastern Time), 7 days a week. You can also check your application status at <u>DisasterAssistance.gov</u>. Survivors have 60-days from the date of a declaration for Individual Assistance to apply for assistance.

Please note that if you are eligible for an Individual Assistance grant you are not required to pay back the grant to FEMA. There is no income threshold for Individual Assistance grants, but you may be referred to the Small Business Administration (SBA) for a low interest disaster loan to assist in your recovery. If you are a disaster survivor, you may qualify for federal assistance.

The registration process will take 18-20 minutes. The process is authorized by the Office of Management and Budget under Control number 1660-0002 with an expiration of November 30, 2017.

- . If you are applying for both home and business disaster assistance, complete one registration to cover both.
- If you are applying for multiple disasters, you will need to complete a registration for each disaster.

Have the following available to complete the registration process:

Social Security Number (SSN)

- . The primary applicant's SSN or
- . The SSN of a minor child in the household who is a U.S. Citizen, Non-Citizen National or Qualified Alien.

(NOTE: If you, your co-applicant, or a minor child in the household are a U.S. Citizen, Non-Citizen National, or a Qualified Alien and do not have a social security number, FEMA will not be able to complete a registration. The Social Security number is required for Identity Verification purposes.)

If registering for a business, the SSN of the person responsible for the business is required.

Financial information

. Family's total gross household income at the time of the disaster

Contact Information

- · Address and phone number of damaged dwelling.
- · Current mailing address and phone numbers where you can be contacted.

Insurance Information

. Identify the types of insurance coverage you have.

Pen and Paper

To record Registration ID number.

Electronic Funds Transfer/Direct Deposit Information

If you are determined to be eligible for assistance and would prefer funds be transferred directly to your account, you must provide the following banking information:

- Institution name
- · Type of account
- Routing and account number
