Fire-rescue, police and medical professionals may not be able to fully meet the community's demand for assistance immediately following a major disaster. That means neighbors will have to rely on each other to meet their critical needs.

The Sunrise Fire-Rescue Department's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program was developed to provide residents with basic training in safety and life-saving skills. Training includes basic disaster-response skills such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

CERT training is free and may help you save a life!

Important Information About Your Drinking Water:
The City of Sunrise Utilities Department will use free chlorine disinfection from December 3 through December 24



The City of Sunrise maintains the highest quality standards to provide clean, safe drinking water to our Utilities Department customers, which include residents and businesses in the cities of Sunrise, Weston, Southwest Ranches and parts of Davie. **From December 3 through December 24**, the Utilities Department will switch from monochloramine to free chlorine disinfection in its drinking water treatment system to provide additional protection against bacteria. This temporary treatment of the water system is a common practice for water suppliers that use chloramine water treatment methods. This periodic program is recommended by the Florida Department of Health. The procedure does not cause any adverse health effects. However, some individuals may notice a slight change in the taste, odor, or color of the water during this time.

Special Considerations

Kidney dialysis centers, nephrologists and hospitals have been notified in order for them to make any adjustments necessary in the various processes which they operate. Any questions regarding **kidney dialysis** should be directed to the user's doctor or dialysis specialist. Some aquatic and marine animal species are sensitive to free chlorine; persons maintaining **aquariums** with any sensitive species may wish to contact their pet supply stores regarding dechlorination.
