Sustainability Advisory Board Meeting Minutes December 12, 2018

I. Welcome

a. Roll Call:

Present: Marcus Austin, Sangeeta Dhulashia, Michael Fils-Aime, Ryan Goldman, Sarah Ham, Laila Kitchen, N. Skye McCloud, Emolyn Shaw, Lawrence Szeliga and Derric Tay. **Staff:** Carrie Kashar (Sustainability Officer).

b. Approval of Meeting Minutes:

The minutes for the month of November meeting was approved by the Board.

- c. Events and Announcements:
 - i. The Chair informed the Board about the following:
 - 1. The City sent in 9 more habitat yard certifications since the last meeting which increased the total to 14 homes since October 2018.
 - 2. The Broward County Schools Climate Summit is scheduled for January 22, 2019. The Summit is only for Broward County students and they are currently accepting applications from students in middle and high school, up to a maximum of 500 students. They are also looking for sponsors who would have to pay a sponsorship fee of \$250, and would be able to display their information in an exhibit area wherein the students would be able to come and learn valuable information. Each school who had participating students in the Summit would have to create a Climate Action Plan for their school.
 - 3. It was also related to the Board that the date of the next scheduled Board meeting was changed from January 9, 2019 to January 23, 2019, as the Sustainability Officer was summoned for Jury Duty.

II. Public Open Discussion:

There was no one from the public in attendance for the meeting.

III. Old Business:

a. Recycle Update:

The Sustainability Officer reported to the Board there were no new updates, and they were not expecting to hear anything about Recycling until next year. She also noted that in the City Commission meeting which was held on December 11, 2018, it was reported that Richard Salamon, City Manager, was participating on the Regional Solid Waste Board, and that Broward County along with other cities who were participating were now looking into a regional approach to waste.

The Board was informed there were laws which were passed in South Beach and the Keys of Florida wherein the restaurant businesses are not allowed to have any type of plastic straws in their establishments, only paper or biodegradable straws are allowed because the plastic straws were harmful to the wildlife and the fish as it killed them when they ingested it.

The Sustainability Officer also reported there was an international group working on the Refuse the Straw Campaign, and that it was a recommendation she was planning to discuss with the Board to implement moving forward with the Sustainability Action Plan.

b. Sunrise Country Club Follow-Up:

The Chair informed the Board that there was no update on the matter, but it was an item which would be revisited in January 2019 at the next meeting.

The Sustainability Officer announced that Alan Gavazzi, Director of Capital Projects, has been invited to present an update on the City Hall Project for the January 2019 meeting, and Mark Lubelski, Assistant City Manager, was invited to attend the meeting in February 2019.

c. Metropica:

A Board member inquired if there were plans for any type of green space at the Metropica location. The Chair responded they have a small park which will be developed within the middle of the development, but there were no additional details on the matter. The Board suggested getting a status of the Metropica development from representatives from the Community Development department.

IV. New Business:

a. SAB Action Plan for 2019:

The Sustainability Officer reported to the board that the Sustainability Action Plan (SAP) was in the final stages with a graphic designer, and the final draft has been distributed to the City's staff for review. She noted that she would like to submit the finalized SAP to the City Commissioners by the January 22, 2019, meeting, or depending on the finalization of the plan, it may be pushed to February 2019.

The Board discussed that the staff should look at the SAP and develop some goals, objectives, and policies over the next year or so, so that they can be integrated into the Comprehensive Plan with some tangible actions.

The Sustainability Officer related to the Board that in January 2019 she will have the implementation plan with the timeline and the indicators for the SAP which she will be reporting on and focusing on for the first year.

The Board discussed that if the City could identify 3 or 4 schools wherein 2 or 3 students who would champion the Climate Action Plans within the City's service area, and if the Board could bring value to them by helping them with the process from their perspective, then it would be a good effect within the community.

The Sustainability Officer responded that it was the type of idea that she would like to do with the students who were going to be involved in the Broward Youth Climate Summit.

Next, the Sustainability Officer facilitated an action planning exercise. The first step was a brainstorming session where the Board was asked to write down different ideas as to what they would like to see occurring within the Board meetings. The Board were then instructed to write down their top 2 ideas. This resulted in the following list:

- Earth Hour
- Install 100,000 Oaks
- Children Learning Sustainability
- Providing the SAP with the Comprehensive Plan and developing an Ordinance
- Plant more trees
- Demonstration Garden
- Facility Energy Study

- Implement State Park
- Natural Area Sites
- Free City Mulch
- Expand Social Media such as Instagram and Twitter
- Climate Interactive Game

- Refuse the Straw Campaign
- Business & Environmental Friendly Material
