Know what's **below**. **Call** before you dig.

Landscaping, installing a fence, or replacing a mailbox? Chances are, underground utilities are nearby. That's why — for safety's sake — Florida law requires that you (or your contractor) notify the state's one-call center, Sunshine 811, before starting any project that involves digging.

Contacting Sunshine 811 for a locate ticket is the only way to have underground utility lines located and marked. Best of all, the service is free!

The process is simple:

1. NOTIFY



Doing the digging yourself? Call 811 or visit www.sunshine811.com/homeowner at least two full business days before work is set to begin. (For example, if you want to dig on a Saturday, Sunday, or Monday, you must call no later than Wednesday. Weekends and holidays are not counted in the two-day notification window.) You'll be asked a few questions to pinpoint where you're digging. And you'll need to write down the locate ticket number you're provided with. If you've hired a contractor to handle the digging, tell them to contact 811.

2. WAIT



Sunshine 811 will inform local utilities about your diagina plans; These utilities have two full business days to respond. Most will send locators to mark underground lines with paint and flags. (Please note that they won't locate private lines or irrigation systems, or water lines running from a meter to a house.) The paint and flag colors represent the utility line buried below:

- = Electric Sewer
- Water
- Phone, Cable, Internet
- \bullet = Gas
- Reclaimed Water



3. CONFIRM Confirm that all affected utility operators have responded to your request by visiting www.sunshine811.com/ homeowner and entering your locate ticket number into the Positive Response System. Never assume that no marks mean no utility lines.

4. DIG **CAREFULLY**



Respect the utility operators' marks and dia carefully. Utility marks are not exact and each utility has a tolerance zone that extends 24 inches from the marks. Dig safely in this area. Also note that marks expire in 30 days. If your project lasts longer than that – or if the marks fade or the flags are removed before digging is finished – contact 811 for a new locate ticket.

What happens if I hit a utility line?

Every six minutes an underground utility line is damaged because someone decided to dig without first calling 811. Striking a single line can lead to injury, repair costs, fines and utility outages.

If you're digging and you hit a utility line, you must stop digging whether there is visible damage or not. If you can identify the line you hit, contact that utility immediately.

There are special instructions in the event that you hit a gas line:

- Call 911.
- Do not attempt to find the source of the odor.
- Do not attempt to shut off any valves or meters.
- If you see blowing dirt or hear a hissing sound, stay clear of the area. Keep everyone away.
