New Business

<u>The City's Response to COVID-19</u>- In an effort to stop the spread of COVID-19, the City closed facilities to the public, cancelled programs and operated remotely, asking as many employees as possible to telecommute. Leisure Services shifted its focus to inform residents about available local, state and federal social services resources. Throughout the pandemic, staff members from every

division worked within the community, providing a variety of services while maintaining CDC guidelines to ensure public safety.

Social Services

- Drive thru Food Distribution- worked with Feeding South Florida, has assisted with 63 events, with an estimated 43,000 meals given away to date
- Compassion Call Center- assisted residents with questions about COVID-19 testing, paying bills, finding housing, etc.
- Assisted the Islamic Foundation with food distribution
- o Walmart delivery program- assisted seniors with food deliveries
- ADRC delivery program- assisted with frozen food deliveries
- Worked with Rotary Club of Weston to provide Sunrise residents with restaurant food and support local restaurant businesses.
- Cares Act Funding- Leisure employees assisted the City's Grants Division in distributing Federal and State monies to residents that needed help paying their utility bills, rent and mortgages.

Aquatics

o Re-opened pools in June with COVID-19 protocols in place

Athletics

- o Implemented an online E Gaming Tournament
- Youth Soccer- small, scaled down program
- o Youth Baseball- small, scaled down program

Programs

- Summer Camp 2020- ran a small camp for about 100 children for working parents in need of childcare
- Summer Camp 2021 is being planned for about 300 children this year

Tennis

o Interior renovations were made to the facility during its closure

Cultural Arts

- Tech staff was responsible for the City's virtual commission meetings and filming videos
- Built a large sign in support of all 2020 graduates
- Tech staff are busy building large holiday decorations

Special Events

- Graduation Parade for Piper High School's Class of 2020
- Drive-In Movies
- o Drive-Thru Back to School Round-Up with 850 backpacks given away
- Virtual 911 Ceremony
- Virtual Halloween 5k Race for approximately 150 participants
- o Drive-Thru Halloween Event for approximately 1275 children
- o Drive-Thru Winter Wonderland Event for approximately 1000 children
- o Drive-Thru EggStravaganza for 600 children
- Drive-Thru Earth Day Event
- Assisted Broward County with a virtual dance for Special Populations

Facilities Maintenance

 Staff continued to work diligently keeping the parks open for residents to enjoy. The fields were closed until re-opening in June with COVID-19 protocols in place.

Golf

 The Bridges at Springtree re-opened in June with COVID-19 protocols and restrictions in place. The golf course has been very busy since reopening.

 - All bus services were stopped and the drivers were busy with food deliveries. At this time, transportation is running "on demand" until further notice.

<u>G.O. Bond Projects Update-</u> Kevin Pickard shared a few status updates on the projects which continued throughout the pandemic:

- Civic Center Athletic Club renovation was completed and reopened to the public with social distancing protocols in place. Entry is free for the use of everything except the cardio and weight machines.
- City Park renovation was completed and is now open.
- The Senior Center is very close to completion and the plan is to reopen when all other facilities and programs start again.

<u>Future Meetings-</u> Board members shared their views about returning to in person meetings as we work towards returning to pre-COVID operations. All views will be taken into consideration as the City staff awaits a decision to be handed down from the City Manager's Office.
