In addition to its original CDBG CV-1 allocation of \$406,724, the City has received an additional allocation of \$599,957 in CDBG CV-3 funds under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) to support the City's Infectious Disease Response.

Federal regulations governing the City of Sunrise 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and the 2019 Annual Action Plan require that members of the public be provided reasonable notice of and opportunity to comment on any substantial amendment to the plans, per 24 CFR Part 91:505.
