On 10/06/2021, I responded as a backup officer to the area of the Home Depot (2901 N University Dr) in reference to a possible mentally ill male running through traffic. Officers originally received a call at 3693 N University Dr about a male going crazy and screaming inside the Starbucks. The anonymous caller advised that the male left northbound on foot. Officers circulated and were unable to locate the subject north of the Starbucks. Ofc. Martin advised dispatch he had located a male in his late 20's wearing a long-sleeve gray shirt at North University Dr and W Oakland Park Blvd. Ofc. Martin stated that he was going to attempt to make contact with the male. Ofc. Martin then advised dispatch that the male was running away from him southbound through traffic towards Home Depot. Ofc. Martin advised an accident occurred as a result of the male's actions.

At the time of my arrival, I observed a white male, later identified as [REDACTED], matching the description given by Ofc. Martin, walking southbound on N University Dr. in traffic. I was in a marked City of Sunrise Police vehicle at the intersection of 2700 N University Dr. I then observed [REDACTED] dart across the southbound traffic lanes in an effort to avoid me. I activated my overhead emergency lights and blocked/stopped southbound traffic with my vehicle. I then observed [REDACTED] attempting to pull on the door handles of occupied stationary vehicles in traffic. [REDACTED] appeared to be in a panic and sounded paranoid as he repeatedly screamed, "No, No, No, don't hurt me." I exited my patrol vehicle wearing my department-issued Class B uniform, drew my department-issued Taser, and issued multiple lawful commands for [REDACTED] to "get on the floor, get on the floor." [REDACTED] continued to look for a vehicle to get in and ultimately began to run in my direction. During this time, I continued to give verbal commands to [REDACTED] which he did not comply. I deployed my Taser as [REDACTED] was running past me. I verbally stated, "taser deployed." The first deployment appeared ineffective, and I deployed a second time which was also ineffective. [REDACTED] continued to run for a very short distance, stumbled while attempting to turn around, fell in the street, and got back up. During this time, I continued to give [REDACTED] commands to stay on the ground, and again he failed to comply. [REDACTED] again attempted to flee from officers. I then escorted [REDACTED] to the ground on the northwest corner of N University Dr. and NW 27th PL. [REDACTED] was taken down in the grass near the street but rolled onto the sidewalk. [REDACTED] continued to tense, brace, scream, kick his legs while officers attempted to restrain him. [REDACTED] sustained minor abrasions to his knees during the process of him kicking and flailing while officers attempted to detain him. Throughout my interaction with [REDACTED] he was screaming, extremely paranoid and sweating profusely.

With the assistance of Ofc. Martin, Ofc. Schwab and Ofc. McCarthy, officers were able to detain [REDACTED] (See their supplements for further.) Due to [REDACTED] constant kicking and flailing of his legs, Ofc. Martin applied leg shackles. It should be noted that I observed that the three Taser prongs never penetrated through [REDACTED] outer layer of clothing and were attached to his gray long-sleeve shirt. I observed one prong attached to the left shoulder area of [REDACTED] long-sleeve shirt and two prongs attached to his left-side lower back area. It is unknown if the last prong did not

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make contact with [REDACTED] or if the prong had been ripped off during the process of detaining him.

While awaiting Fire-Rescue to arrive on scene, [REDACTED] was speaking incoherently and kept advising he was thirsty. Officers placed [REDACTED] in the seated position and provided him with some water.

Sgt. Pullease responded to the scene and was briefed on the incident and the taser deployments.

Sunrise Fire-Rescue 59 responded to the scene and assessed [REDACTED]. Rescue 59 assisted in transporting [REDACTED] to University Medical Center and Ofc. Martin rode inside of the Rescue truck. While at the hospital, [REDACTED] advised me that he had taken Molly (MDMA). Hospital staff removed [REDACTED] taser prongs and gave [REDACTED] medication that was able to suppress [REDACTED] anxiety and panic.

Due to [REDACTED] actions mentioned above and his altered mental state, he was admitted to University Hospital as a Baker Act.

It became apparent during my interaction with [REDACTED] that he is unable to determine for himself whether examination is necessary. Without care or treatment, [REDACTED] is likely to refuse to care for himself, and such refusal poses a real and present threat of substantial harm to his well-being. It is not apparent that such harm may be avoided through the help of willing family members or the provision of other services. There is a substantial likelihood that without care or treatment, [REDACTED] will cause serious bodily harm to himself/others in the near future, as evidenced by recent behavior.

A routine NCIC/FCIC check on [REDACTED] revealed no wants or warrants.

A CEW and RRR were filled out and given to Sgt. C. Pullease.

The deployed Taser cartridges (C6202CHT7 and C6202CK03) and prongs were submitted to Sunrise PD evidence.


On 10-06-21, I responded as a backup officer to a disturbance at the Starbucks on 3551 N. University Dr. Upon arrival to the area, I observed a male later identified as [REDACTED] (IO) at the northeast corner of N. University Drive and W. Oakland Park Blvd. [REDACTED] matched the description given over the police radio and he was yelling random statements as he was walking southbound. [REDACTED] appeared oblivious to his surroundings as he crossed W. Oakland Park Blvd without even looking for traffic.

Officers approached [REDACTED] by the Burger King (3100 block of N. University). [REDACTED] quickly ran across N. University Dr. again not looking for traffic. Based on his demeanor and actions, it was in my opinion that [REDACTED] had to be detained for his safety. Several attempts were made to detain [REDACTED], but he continued to run back and forth across N. University Dr. It should be noted that N. University Dr. had heavy traffic and vehicles had to swerve around [REDACTED] several times. After a brief foot pursuit, officers managed to catch up to [REDACTED] on the corner of NW 27th Place and N. University Dr. [REDACTED] was given several verbal commands to stop running, but he continued to try to evade us. At that time, due to the imminent threat of [REDACTED] going into traffic again, I was going to use my department taser on [REDACTED], but Ofc. Wray who was next to me, tasered [REDACTED] first. After a struggle, [REDACTED] was placed in handcuffs without further incident. Due to his erratic behavior and taser deployment, rescue was immediately requested. Ofc. Wray initiated a Baker Act and I rode with Rescue 59 to University Hospital where he was left in the custody of the Baker Act team. It should be noted that [REDACTED] continued his erratic behavior all the way to the hospital and the medical staff had to sedate him to control his violent outbursts.

I responded to the area of 2700 N University Dr in reference to a white male running in and out of traffic. As I arrived on scene, Ofc. Wray and Ofc. Martin were in an active struggle with the subject, later identified as [REDACTED], in an attempt to detain him. As I approached, Ofc. Martin could be heard saying, "Don't grab my gun. Don't grab my gun." [REDACTED] was actively resisting officers, who were all in their Class B uniforms, by tensing, pulling, pushing, and thrashing. [REDACTED] continuously yelled and shouted at officers as officers attempted to detain him. After detaining [REDACTED] continued to thrash and kick officers. Leg shackles were placed on [REDACTED] for his and officer's protection. [REDACTED] was profusely sweating and would not respond to officers' commands and questions. [REDACTED] exhibited extreme paranoia and believed someone was out to hurt him. Rescue soon arrived and [REDACTED] was assisted onto the stretcher and transported to University Hospital as a Baker act.



As I arrived I observed a white male with a gray shirt on the sidewalk on the west side of University Dr. at the 2900 block. The male then ran into southbound traffic across University Dr. toward the east side of the street until I started to drive toward him in my patrol car going northbound. The male then turned around and went back into southbound traffic which I relayed over police radio. As I looped around from northbound to southbound traffic and pulled up at the 2700 block of N. University Dr. officers had the male on the ground and were trying to take him into custody. I ran over and assisted the officers until the male was detained. The male had taser prongs and taser wire attached to him. The male kept asking for water and I gave him some from a water bottle. Sunrise Fire Rescue responded and transported the male to the hospital.



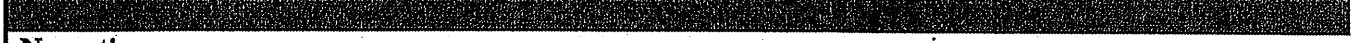

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**Narrative**

On 10/06/2021, I responded as a backup officer to the area of the Home Depot (2901 N University Dr) in reference to a possible mentally ill male running through traffic. Officers originally received a call at 3693 N University Dr about a male going crazy and screaming inside the Starbucks. The anonymous caller advised that the male left northbound on foot. Officers circulated and were unable to locate the subject north of the Starbucks. Ofc. Martin advised dispatch he had located a male in his late 20's wearing a long-sleeve gray shirt at North University Dr and W Oakland Park Blvd. Ofc. Martin stated that he was going to attempt to make contact with the male. Ofc. Martin then advised dispatch that the male was running away from him southbound through traffic towards Home Depot. Ofc. Martin advised an accident occurred as a result of the male's actions.

At the time of my arrival, I observed a white male, later identified as [REDACTED] matching the description given by Ofc. Martin, walking southbound on N University Dr. in traffic. I was in a marked City of Sunrise Police vehicle at the intersection of 2700 N University Dr. I then observed [REDACTED] dart across the southbound traffic lanes in an effort to avoid me. I activated my overhead emergency lights and blocked/stopped southbound traffic with my vehicle. I then observed [REDACTED] attempting to pull on the door handles of occupied

stationary vehicles in traffic. [REDACTED] appeared to be in a panic and sounded paranoid as he repeatedly screamed, "No, No, No, don't hurt me." I exited my patrol vehicle wearing my department-issued Class B uniform, drew my department-issued Taser, and issued multiple lawful commands for [REDACTED] to "get on the floor, get on the floor." [REDACTED] continued to look for a vehicle to get in and ultimately began to run in my direction. During this time, I continued to give verbal commands to [REDACTED] which he did not comply. I deployed my Taser as [REDACTED] was running past me. I verbally stated, "taser deployed." The first deployment appeared ineffective, and I deployed a second time which was also ineffective. [REDACTED] continued to run for a very short distance, stumbled while attempting to turn around, fell in the street, and got back up. During this time, I continued to give [REDACTED] commands to stay on the ground, and again he failed to comply. [REDACTED] again attempted to flee from officers. I then escorted [REDACTED] to the ground on the northwest corner of N University Dr. and NW 27th PL. [REDACTED] was taken down in the grass near the street but rolled onto the sidewalk. [REDACTED] continued to tense, brace, scream, kick his legs while officers attempted to restrain him. [REDACTED] sustained minor abrasions to his knees during the process of him kicking and flailing while officers attempted to detain him. Throughout my interaction with [REDACTED] he was screaming, extremely paranoid and sweating profusely.

With the assistance of Ofc. Martin, Ofc. Schwab and Ofc. McCarthy, officers were able to detain [REDACTED] (See their supplements for further.) Due to [REDACTED] constant kicking and flailing of his legs, Ofc. Martin applied leg shackles. It should be noted that I observed that the three Taser prongs never penetrated through [REDACTED] outer layer of clothing and were attached to his gray long-sleeve shirt. I observed one prong attached to the left shoulder area of [REDACTED] long-sleeve shirt and two prongs attached to his left-side lower back area. It is unknown if the last prong did not make contact with [REDACTED] or if the prong had been ripped off during the process of detaining him.

While awaiting Fire-Rescue to arrive on scene, [REDACTED] was speaking incoherently and kept advising he was thirsty. Officers placed [REDACTED] in the seated position and provided him with some water.

Sunrise Fire-Rescue 59 responded to the scene and assessed [REDACTED]. Rescue 59 assisted in transporting [REDACTED] to University Medical Center and Ofc. Martin rode inside of the Rescue truck. While at the hospital, [REDACTED] advised me that he had taken Molly (MDMA). Hospital staff removed [REDACTED] taser prongs and gave [REDACTED] medication that was able to suppress [REDACTED] anxiety and panic.
