BSO Communications advised, per the caller, the subject is talking crazy saying if someone dies tonight it will be her fault. The caller then advised the subject is running away. At this time, Officers Nelson and Negrón arrived on scene and established contact with the subject. Officer Nelson then requested additional units to respond to the incident location. Following this transmission from Officer Nelson, I immediately began traveling to the incident location. BSO Communications was then unable to establish radio communications with both Officers Nelson and Negrón. Officer Nelson then advised over the radio that he was aiming his Taser at the subject. As I arrived to the incident location in my marked Sunrise Police patrol unit with flashing blue lights activated, the subject suddenly ran into the street and in front of my vehicle. The subject began to approach the driver side of my vehicle in a quick and aggressive manner. When the subject was close to me and my vehicle he looked at me and began shouting, "Shoot me!" "Shoot me!!" At this point, I issued several verbal commands to the subject to "Get down!", "On the ground!". The subject disobeyed every command that I issued him. As a result of the subjects resistance to my commands, 2 taser deployments from my department issued Axon Taser 7 were discharged. As a result of the successful probe deployment, the</p>

subject was temporarily incapacitated for the duration of the cycle. The subject proceeded to fall onto the cement sidewalk and sustained abrasions to his face and hands. He was then taken into custody by Sunrise Police Officers and transported by Sunrise Fire Rescue to Florida Medical Center where he was ultimately Baker Acted and remained in their custody.





Subject's Behavior

Subject, [redacted], was intoxicated / raising hands / shouting and arguing with officers and girlfriend in front of his residence. [redacted] had a strong smell of an alcoholic type beverage and was identified as a previous abuser of alcohol. [redacted] shouted for the officers on scene to shoot him and his girlfriend reaffirmed his level of intoxication and statements towards officers. [redacted] walked and ran around his residence, the girlfriend's car and the neighboring houses to avoid contact with officers.

Once the taser was activated to display the red and green laser, it was successful in getting [redacted] to remain non-combative, raise his arms, turn away from the device and to lean up against a blue Honda in compliance with orders to stand / back down and to stop approaching officers.

However, the taser was ineffective in reference to subject following commands to return to his residence with parents.

On 11/30/2021, I responded to 2839 NW 87th Ave in reference to two 911 hang-up calls with a disturbance in the background. Upon my arrival to the scene, I observed a white male in an agitated state, later identified as [REDACTED] wearing all-black clothing walking away from a blue Honda Accord. As I exited my patrol vehicle, I could hear [REDACTED] cursing at Officer T. Nelson, who was already on scene and standing next to the Honda. Sitting in the driver's seat of the Honda was a woman named [REDACTED]. I watched as [REDACTED] walked towards the Honda, and leaned up against the driver-side door of the vehicle, and began calling [REDACTED] a "Bitch" and telling her it was her fault.

When Officer Nelson tried approaching [REDACTED] he became angry and aggressively walked towards Officer Nelson which caused Officer Nelson to retreat. I then watched as Officer Nelson pulled his taser and pointed it at [REDACTED] to get him to calm down and comply. [REDACTED] then walked away from Officer Nelson. [REDACTED] once again approached Officer Nelson this time with his hands up telling Officer Nelson to shoot him. I made several attempts to deescalate the situation by diverting his attention to me. [REDACTED] failed to comply and continue to focus on Officer Nelson and Isisgema. [REDACTED] once again walked away from the vehicle.

I then spoke with [REDACTED] who was still sitting in her vehicle. [REDACTED] stated that they went out for [REDACTED] birthday. He drank about 4 margaritas and became upset with her. [REDACTED] then drove him home where the argument began. [REDACTED] stated that he became upset and stated that "if the cops come tonight, that he was going to die." He advised that he was going to get shot tonight. [REDACTED] was upset because [REDACTED] was sleeping with another guy. [REDACTED] stated that they were just friends and were not in a relationship.

While I was speaking with [REDACTED] I could hear Officer Grassetti giving [REDACTED] commands to stop. [REDACTED] failed to comply and Officer Grassetti tased him. See Officer Grassetti's supplement.

I spoke with his mother, Carmen Matute, and his step-father, Randy Polete, outside the residence. They advised that [REDACTED] does not have any mental illness or currently taking any medication. [REDACTED] only has problems when he drinks. I tried to make [REDACTED] go home with Carmen, but he refused and pulled away from her.

Based on [REDACTED] actions and [REDACTED] statement, [REDACTED] is unable to determine for himself whether an examination is necessary. Without care or treatment, [REDACTED] is likely to pose a real threat of substantial harm to his well-being and it is not apparent that such harm may be avoided through the help of willing family members or friends. There is a substantial likelihood that without care or treatment the individual will cause serious bodily harm to himself.

Sunrise Fire-Rescue 59 responded to the scene and transported [REDACTED] to Florida Medical center. Once he was medically clear, [REDACTED] was left in the care of the Baker Act unit. Photographs of his injuries were taken and uploaded to evidence.com.

I responded to the listed incident in reference to a disturbance involving the reporter wishing for a passenger to depart her vehicle.

Upon arrival and a check of the area, I observed a blue in color Honda in the northbound lane of 87th Avenue stopped at 28th place. Upon engaging my emergency lights, the passenger exited the vehicle and stood on the sidewalk. As I approached the vehicle, the individual began to run eastbound on 28th place.

I then met with the driver, [redacted] who advised [redacted] was her boyfriend and that he was intoxicated and had just finished celebrating his birthday. [redacted] advised that she had a verbal argument with her boyfriend and just wanted him to leave the vehicle so she could return to her residence in Davie, Fl. As I questioned [redacted] about his mental state, she advised that he wanted to be shot by officers for her calling them. As I asked [redacted] to hang up with Sunrise dispatch, I continued watching and observed [redacted] starting to walk westbound on 28th place back towards the incident location.

While still speaking with [redacted], [redacted] came back to the location of the vehicle, shouting that his hands were up, that he was unarmed, had been drinking, had an argument with his girl and was celebrating his birthday. It was apparent that [redacted] was clearly intoxicated and that he was only holding a cellular phone in his hands as he slurred statements at officers, his girlfriend and parents and initial attempts to return him to his residence were met with negative results.

As [redacted] approached this officer with his hands raised and continued to walk toward me, I drew my department issued taser and selected the lever for the laser display. As I pointed the taser in Jose's direction, I raised my other hand and commanded him to stop. [redacted] eventually turned towards the blue Honda and leaned against the vehicle close to the driver door. [redacted] can then be heard trying to speak with [redacted] through her closed window on the driver side of the vehicle as a request for additional units to respond was advised to Sunrise dispatch.

While waiting on additional officers, I advised the description of the intoxicated individual to Sunrise Dispatch.

Two other individuals, later identified as the parents of [redacted], then came out of a residence located at 2839 NW 87th Ave, Sunrise, Fl. As they approached officers, [redacted] began to walk away southbound on 87th Ave on the eastern sidewalk heading towards NW 28th Street. I then reholstered my taser as I questioned the parents on [redacted] mental stability.

Upon speaking with the parents, they began explaining [redacted] problems with alcohol and that a similar situation had occurred before. As I began to ask about his mental stability, the parents stated that [redacted] had never been Baker Acted, but [redacted] stated, from the vehicle, that [redacted] mentioned of getting shot by the cops. [redacted] also

advised that no incidents other than a verbal argument occurred prior to officers initial arrival.

As I spoke with the other parties, continued to walk off his drunkenness in a southbound direction. I continuously maintained a visual of as he walked down the eastern most sidewalk along 87th Avenue, south of his residence.

As other officers arrived, I observed start to move rapidly towards the roadway and I advised, on the radio, for all responding marked units to slow and stop their vehicles to alleviate the possibility of striking the subject with a vehicle.

From a distance, I could see walking rapidly in front of a Sunrise Police Department unit and towards an officer as he exited his marked unit. Ofc Grassetti then advised of a taser deployment. I subsequently responded to his aid and handcuffed for officer safety. (See Ofc Grassetti's supplement)

Sunrise Rescue elements were then requested and arrived on scene. Rescue then secured and subsequently transported him to Florida Medical Center (FMC) for further observation.

Afterwards, I briefly spoke with the parents, issued a Sunrise case card and then officers then cleared without further incident.

On 11/30/2021, BSO Communications received two (2) calls regarding a disturbance between a male and female inside a vehicle (related case number 42-2111-049120). BSO Communications advised, per the caller, the subject is talking crazy saying if someone dies tonight it will be her fault. The caller then advised the subject is running away.

At this time, Officers Nelson and Negron arrived on scene and established contact with the subject. Officer Nelson then requested additional units to respond to the incident location. Following this transmission from Officer Nelson, I immediately began traveling to the incident location. BSO Communications was then unable to establish radio communications with both Officers Nelson and Negron.

Officer Nelson then advised over the radio that he was aiming his Taser at the subject. As I arrived to the incident location in my marked Sunrise Police patrol unit with flashing blue lights activated, the subject suddenly ran into the street and in front of my vehicle. The subject began to approach the driver side of my vehicle in a quick and aggressive manner. When the subject was close to me and my vehicle he looked at me and began shouting, "Shoot me!" "Shoot me!!" At this point, I issued several verbal commands to the subject to "Get down!", "On the ground!". The subject disobeyed every command I issued him. As a result of the subjects resistance to my commands, 2 taser deployments from my department issued Axon Taser 7 were discharged. As a result of the successful probe deployment, the subject was temporarily incapacitated for the duration of the cycle. The subject proceeded to fall onto the cement sidewalk and sustained abrasions to his face and hands. He was then taken into custody by Sunrise Police Officers.

The subject was transported to Florida Medical Center by Sunrise Fire Rescue for the treatment of his injuries. The taser probes were removed by FMC personnel. I collected the probes after removal which were placed into Evidence along with the spent taser cartridges. The subject was then placed into the care of the FMC Baker Act unit.

An interview of the subject at FMC revealed he was under the influence of alcohol and had recently consumed cannabis on the previous day. The subject advised he was emotionally upset due to the female having sex with another man. While speaking with the subject, he was slurring his words and lost his balance several times when attempting to change from the clothing he arrived in to the hospital garment issued by FMC staff.

Photographs of the subject and his injuries were taken on Ofc. D. Negron`s department issued tablet and uploaded to Evidence.com.

An on-scene interview of the female revealed that the subject was under the influence of alcohol. My BWC was active during the incident. The BWC and Taser were later downloaded into Evidence.

On November 30, 2021, at approximately 5:11am, Road Patrol Officers responded to a disturbance at 2839 N.W. 87 Avenue. The two (2) case numbers associated with the call were Case #42-2111-049120 and #42-2111-049121.

The two (2) subjects involved in the disturbance were later identified as [redacted] and [redacted]. During the call, Officer Grassetti deployed his Taser on [redacted].

Sergeant Calvano responded to the scene and interviewed [redacted]. In summary, [redacted] advised that [redacted] was her friend. She drove her vehicle and picked him up from his residence. [redacted] and [redacted] then traveled from the residence to the Davie Ale House where he consumed alcohol. Next, [redacted] and [redacted] traveled from the Davie Ale House to Cheers where he consumed more alcohol. Finally, [redacted] and [redacted] traveled from Cheers to the residence where he consumed even more alcohol.

Upon arrival to the residence, [redacted] and [redacted] engaged in a verbal argument and [redacted] refused to exit the vehicle. [redacted] advised that he wanted the Police to shoot him. [redacted] then contacted the Police and provided this information to BSO Communications.

Upon Police arrival to the scene, [redacted] exited the vehicle and began running around the neighborhood yelling for the Police to shoot him. [redacted] ran down the street while she remained in the vehicle. She did not witness the Taser deployment.

[redacted] was transported to Florida Medical Center. Sergeant Calvano responded to the hospital and interviewed [redacted]. [redacted] appeared intoxicated as evident by his bloodshot and watery eyes and the smell of alcohol on his breath. [redacted] had slurred speech and difficulty standing up without swaying as if he was about to fall. [redacted] was also foaming at the corners of his mouth. Based on the training and experience of Sergeant Calvano, this was an indication of a person under the influence of drugs, specifically prescription pills. In summary, [redacted] admitted that he consumed cannabis on the previous day. [redacted] described [redacted] as his girlfriend and it sounded like he had romantic feelings toward her. [redacted] advised that [redacted] picked him up from his residence and they traveled to the bar where he consumed alcohol.

Upon arrival to the residence, [redacted] and [redacted] engaged in a verbal argument and [redacted] refused to exit the vehicle. [redacted] advised that he wanted the Police to shoot him. [redacted] advised that he contacted the Police.

Upon Police arrival to the scene, [redacted] exited the vehicle and began running around the neighborhood yelling for the Police to shoot him. Due to his behavior, [redacted] advised that the Police would have been justified hitting him in the head with a club rather than shooting him with a Taser.

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A review of the Calls For Service Report for both cases revealed that the Notes section stated "NOT GOOD FOR SN SUBJ IS TALKING CRAZY PER CALLER SAYING IF SOMEONE DIES TONIGHT IT WILL BE HER FAULT".

A review of the call made from [redacted] to BSO Communications revealed the following:

- 7:06 [redacted] - "...kill a cop..."
[redacted] - "Are you crazy?"
9:00 [redacted] - "He is talking crazy...it will be my fault if somebody dies tonight."
10:47 [redacted] - "...watch me get killed tonight by a cop..."
[redacted] - "Why?"
10:55 [redacted] - "You`re gonna watch me get killed by a cop tonight."
11:00 [redacted] - "Watch when I start swinging. They`re gonna shoot me..."
11:08 [redacted] (speaking to BSO Communications) - "You hear him?"
11:12 [redacted] - "He`s saying that if he gets killed it will be my fault."
11:43 [redacted] - "...I would see him getting killed by a Police..."

[redacted] statements were consistent with a subject wishing to die at the hands of Police and typically referred to as Suicide-By-Cop.
