<p>Officer [REDACTED] and I were dispatched to the Walmart Super Center (12555 W. Sunrise Blvd., Sunrise, FL 33323) in reference to a suspicious person on drugs that locked himself in a bathroom stall, and was sitting on the floor for over an hour. Officers were directed to the handicap stall, located in the men's restroom at the front of the store. From outside the stall, I could see the subject standing on the other side of the closed stall door, facing the mirror and sink, and could see through the gap between the door and stall that the subject was fully clothed.</p> <p>I knocked on the stall door and the subject opened the stall door only slightly, keeping himself concealed behind the door. I identified myself as Sunrise Police, and asked the subject to exit the stall. The subject refused to exit the stall, stating he was using the bathroom, which he was not. The subject then applied pressure to the door in an apparent attempt to close it.</p> <p>For officer safety reasons, not knowing what the subject may have been concealing behind the door, Officer [REDACTED] and I forced entry into the stall. The subject then backed up and made a series of furtive movements</p>

with his hands, waving his hands in front of his person and then reaching down toward his waistband. Officer [REDACTED] and I attempted to control the subject's hands, at which time he immediately braced and tensed his body, and attempted to pull away from officers. I gave numerous verbal commands for the subject to stop resisting, as Officer [REDACTED] and I struggled to gain his compliance.

After struggling with the subject for approximately 30 seconds, I warned the subject that he would be tased if he did not stop resisting. The subject continued to physically resist, at which time I announced "taser taser taser" and fired my taser one (1) time, striking him on the left side of his upper body and left thigh. After a brief pause, the subject locked up, and began to fall to the ground. As the subject was falling, Officer [REDACTED] attempted to control the subject's head so as to prevent him from striking it on the sink and ground.

Once on the ground, the subject continued to resist until being told he would be tased again if he did not comply, at which time he placed his hands behind his back. Officer [REDACTED] and I were then able to detain the subject in handcuffs.

While escorting the subject to my police vehicle, the subject continued to brace and tense his body, requiring 5 officers to get him secured in my police vehicle. Once detained in the back of my police vehicle (Unite 2159), the subject immediately calmed down, as if a switch had been turned off.

Due to the subject's behavior, and no apparent or disclosed injury, it was determined to be unsafe to have Fire Rescue personnel evaluate him and to remove the taser barbs. It was further determined that without proper care and treatment, the subject posed a risk of neglect and injury to himself and others, and was subsequently Baker Acted. The subject was then transported to Florida Medical Center for medical and psychological care, and turned over to the care and custody of hospital staff. Once at the hospital, it was realized that the taser barbs got caught in the subject's clothing, and never penetrated his skin.

On 01/09/2022, at approximately 17:57 hours, Officer Deweese and I were dispatched to the Walmart Super Center (12555 W. Sunrise Blvd., Sunrise, FL 33323) in reference to a suspicious person on drugs that locked himself in a bathroom stall, and was sitting on the floor for over an hour. Upon arrival, contact was made with Walmart Loss Prevention Agent (LPA) Shanee Foster Shirley. LPA Shanee stated that the male, later identified as [REDACTED], had been in the store for approximately 3 hours overall, and prior to locking himself in the bathroom, had been dancing around the store with his shirt off, talking to himself, and harassing customers.

Officer [REDACTED] and I were directed to the handicap stall, located in the men's restroom at the front of the store. From outside the stall, I could see [REDACTED] standing on the other side of the closed stall door, facing the mirror and sink, and could see through the gap between the door and stall that [REDACTED] was fully clothed.

I knocked on the stall door and [REDACTED] opened the stall door only slightly, keeping himself concealed behind the door. I identified myself as Sunrise Police, and asked [REDACTED] to exit the stall. [REDACTED] refused to exit the stall, stating he was using the bathroom, which he was clearly not. [REDACTED] then applied pressure to the door in an apparent attempt to close it.

For officer safety reasons, not knowing what [REDACTED] may have been concealing behind the door, Officer [REDACTED] and I forced entry into the stall. [REDACTED] then backed up and made a series of furtive movements with his hands, waving his hands in front of his person and then reaching down toward his waistband. Officer [REDACTED] and I attempted to control [REDACTED] hands, at which time he immediately braced and tensed his body, and attempted to pull away from officers. I gave numerous verbal commands for [REDACTED] stop resisting, as Officer [REDACTED] and I struggled to gain his compliance.

From what was conveyed to me regarding [REDACTED] actions prior to contact with law enforcement, combined with my personal observations, it is this Officer's opinion that without proper medical and psychological attention, [REDACTED] poses a serious risk of

personal neglect and possible injury to himself and others. [REDACTED] was subsequently Baker Acted and transported to Florida Medical Center for medical and psychological care.

It should be noted, [REDACTED] appeared disheveled and dirty, had a strong body odor that is consistent with someone that has not showered in a very long time, and appeared to be homeless. While en route to the hospital, [REDACTED] stated he recently purchased a home in the City of Sunrise (under his own name), and that he makes money trading stocks and crypto currencies. Using the Broward County Property Appraiser website, I confirmed that [REDACTED] does not own any property in Broward County. While driving, I observed [REDACTED] repeatedly, vigorously, shaking his head side to side. I asked [REDACTED] why he was shaking his head, and he stated he was simply nodding. I then asked [REDACTED] when was the last time he slept, and he stated 3 days ago.

[REDACTED] was turned over to the care and custody of hospital staff without further incident. Once at the hospital, it was realized that the taser barbs got caught in [REDACTED] clothing, and never penetrated his skin. Due to my use of my department issued taser, I completed a Response to Resistance Report and CEW Use Form. My discharged taser cartridge and both barbs were submitted into SPD Evidence, my taser battery was swapped with a battery from the battery bank, and Sgt. Zinn issued me a replacement close-range cartridge.

Under penalties of perjury I declare that I have read the foregoing and that the facts stated therein are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.

On 1/9/22 I responded to the above location in reference to an unknown male, later identified as [REDACTED] on drugs in the bathroom for over an hour. [REDACTED] was reported to still be in the bathroom sitting on the floor of a stall. The caller (Walmart Loss Prevention) further advised that [REDACTED] had previously been taking his shirt off and dancing inside the of store. Upon arrival contact was made with Walmart employee/ Loss Prevention Shanee Foster Shirly. Shanee informed officers that [REDACTED] was currently still in the bathroom and they desired to have him removed from the premise. Shanee also stated that in addition to the previously mentioned actions of [REDACTED] he had also been harassing customers.

Ofc [REDACTED] and myself then proceeded to the Men's bathroom, with Walmart employees. Upon entering into the bathroom a black male, [REDACTED], could be seen standing in the handicap stall with the door closed. [REDACTED] was standing barefoot directly in front of the door, with his back to the door. As officers approached the stall, Officer [REDACTED] knocked on the stall door. At that time [REDACTED] stared through the crack of the door prior to opening the door. When [REDACTED] opened the door he only cracked the stall door a few inches concealing himself behind the door. Officers instructed [REDACTED] to step out of the restroom, to which he refused. When he was informed that he needed to step out [REDACTED] began to conceal himself more behind the stall door while attempting to close the door on officers. For officer safety concerns, not knowing what [REDACTED] may be concealing behind the door, officers forcefully opened the door.

Once inside the stall [REDACTED] immediately backed up and began to make furtive moves with his hands. [REDACTED] waved his hand around and began to reach downwards towards to his waistband area. Officer [REDACTED] and I then attempted to take control of his hands. [REDACTED] immediately tensed and braced himself, while attempting to pull away from officers. Officer [REDACTED] and I continued to gain control of [REDACTED] as he began to bring his hands into his chest and tense his body. Multiple loud verbal commands were given to [REDACTED] to stop resisting and place his hands behind his back. [REDACTED] refused all commands. Officers continued to struggle with [REDACTED] in an attempt to gain control him, however this was made difficult due to his size and strength. It should also be noted that conditions in the restroom, wet/slippery floor, also hindered officers. While struggling [REDACTED] continued to tense his body and arms, use his weight to push off the walls, and grab at fixtures all in an attempt to defeat our control. During the course of the struggle, Officer [REDACTED] warned [REDACTED] to stop resisting or he would be tased. After giving commands Officer [REDACTED] deployed his taser. After being struck with the taser, [REDACTED] went to the ground. At that time officers were able to roll [REDACTED] on to his stomach and bring his hands to the rear of his back. [REDACTED] was ultimately placed in handcuffs.

After handcuffing [REDACTED] and standing him up, [REDACTED] continued to use his body to push back on officers and pull away. [REDACTED] had to be held up against the wall in order to remain in control. Once additional officers arrived on scene [REDACTED] was escorted outside to a waiting police car. While attempting to walk out of the Walmart, [REDACTED] refused to walk normally. And would continue to use his body and push back on officers. Eventually [REDACTED] was brought outside and placed into the back of a police vehicle.
