Summary of Minutes

I. Call Meeting to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

• The meeting was called to order by Natalia A. and the Pledge of Allegiance was observed by the EAB (led by Natalia A.).

II. Introductions/Roll Call

III. Approval of EAB Summary Minutes

- Quick walk through of meeting agenda items by Natalia A.
- Stacy S. made a motion to approve Meeting 3 minutes from Tuesday, March 1, 2022 with revisions from Dr.
 Carolyn S. Dr Carolyn S. stated to change the new BCPS Superintendent (as of 2/24/22) to Dr. Vickie
 Cartwright (since she has a doctoral degree). Lindsay Ostroff seconded the motion. There was no opposition from the EAB.

IV. Open Discussion: Updates/Announcements Regarding Schools

- Bair Middle: Stacey S. stated on April 13, 2022 events for her school include (a) Math/Science STEM Night and (b) Montessori Magnet Registration Night.
- Banyan Elementary: Carolyn H. was able to connect with the newly appointed Principal Nicole Neunie. She stated she would like the new Principal to come to the EAB meeting in the future. Sady D. stated the Principal should attend the June 2022 meeting, after we complete the Outstanding Citizenship Scholarship Interviews (May 3, 2022).
- Sandpiper Elementary: Dr. Dana R. stated she was able to connect with Assistant Principal Maximo Castillo. Some upcoming events include: (a) FSA pep rally (Super hero theme), (b) moving up ceremony for 5th graders, (c) Math Night to enhance math skills (partnering with Mathnasium), and (d) upcoming summer activities. Dr. Dana R. stated in order to get into the festivities, she has offered to dress as Wonder Woman for the FSA Pep Rally.
- **Discovery Elementary:** Dr. Carolyn S. stated Discovery Elementary is engaged in testing and will have tutoring available in the mornings (7:30 AM 8:00 AM). During tutoring sessions, students work on targeting lessons in reading and math. School events include: (a) Blast Off to Kindergarten where

potential families receive information for incoming Kindergarteners, (b) Virtual multicultural night, and (c) Parent Night. Lastly, approvals are pending for the Cambridge Program to begin with Discovery Elementary, feeding into West Pine Middle, and complete with Piper High School (final feeder school). Natalia A. has a sample syllabus for the Cambridge Program in case any EAB members want to review.

- Welleby Elementary: Lindsey O. stated the school is preparing for FSA testing, which begins next month. Events include: FSA pep rally (April 29, 2022) and Kindergarten/5th Grade Promotion Ceremony.
- Franklin Academy: Lindsey O. provided an update for Franklin Academy since she works at the school and Erncy D. (EAB Chair/Liaison for Franklin Academy) was not able to attend because he was receiving a Commission Proclamation (Autism). The school events include: (a) FSA and EOC preparations will begin, (b) graduation pictures will begin April 13, 2022 for Kindergarten/8th grade, (c) the prom committee is planning the 8th grade dance; and (d) end of the year field trips are rolling out. Franklin Academy has received new databases and the school is looking to revamp the school library.
- Horizon Elementary: Natalia A. stated a few events were canceled due to getting adjusted to a new school year (Pandemic) and fluctuation of staff/teachers. Natalia A. made a recommendation to the EAB to attend the School Advisory Council (SAC) meetings, which are open to the public. Attending the SAC meetings will help with actively connecting with administration and staff.

V. Old Business: (a) OCS 2021 Candidate Update, (b) OCS Informational Updates and (c) SLA Session 3/Session 4

- OCS 2021 Candidate Update: Sady D. provided an update on 2021 scholarship recipient Keisha Stvil.
- OCS Informational Updates: Sady D. stated only two (2) students attended the information virtually. Ada Griffin (Scholarship Administrator) stated to Sady D. she received six (6) applications and twenty-seven (27) applications were received through the Broward Education Foundation (BEF) scholarship portal. All applicants will go through a BEF screening process to ensure qualification was met.
- SLA Session 3: What Legacy Do You Want to Leave Behind? (Wednesday, April 13, 2022).
- SLA Session 4: Flamingle (4-minute informational interviews) (Wednesday, May 4, 2022). Sady D. needs a doctor and a dentist to actively participate in the 2.5-hour event. Natalia A. stated she would follow up because she may have some people within her network.
- Teacher-of-the-Month: Natalia A. inquired about the process Teacher-of-the-Month. The selection process comes from school principal selecting the Teacher-of-the-Year from the previous year. Sady D. will email the dates for Teacher-of-the-Month and a letter/certificate will be distributed.

VI. New Business: OCS Timeline/In-Person Interview Procedures/Questions, ESRA 5 \$250 – Scholarships, and PFEP for Sandpiper ES/ Franklin Academy

OCS Timeline:

- o April 25/April 26: Student interview prep (Sady D.)
- o May 3 (5:30 pm): Interviews begin 15 minutes after EAB updates/wrap up.

- o **June 1:** Students receive eligibility confirmation and 2022 Award Certificates.
- June 3: Notify award recipients/invite them to attend the Tuesday, June 14, 2022
 City Commission Meeting.
- o June 14: Awards presentation at the Commission Meeting.

 July 1: Broward Education Foundation (BEF) will send out official awards notifications and contracts.

• OCS Procedures/Questions:

- O Dr. Carolyn S. made a motion to have the EAB members ask questions during the Outstanding Citizenship Scholarship (OCS). Lindsay O. second the motion. There was no opposition from the EAB.
- o Please feel free to send Sady D. any additional questions that you may like to have added to the interview questions list by April 25, 2022 (prior interview prep).

ESRA 5 \$250 – Additional Scholarships:

- o East Sunrise Residents Association (ESRA) Scholarships (Latoya Clarke, ESRA President): ESRA will have five (5) \$250 scholarships for distribution. The scholarships are geared towards students who live in (a) East Sunrise (east of University Drive) and (b) complete both an application/essay. Intake will take place for May/June 2022.
- Sady D. encouraged the EAB to please inform her of any HOA scholarship opportunities (Central Sunrise Residents Association and Western Sunrise Residents Association) in order to share with the residents.

PFEP for <u>Sandpiper ES</u>/ Franklin Academy (<u>English</u> + <u>Spanish</u>)

Sady D. provided PFEP handouts for Sandpiper Elementary and Franklin Academy.
 All requirements were met for both schools – which included: (a) EAB meeting website link/notes online (72 hours prior to EAB Meeting #4); (b) link in EAB Power Points; and (c) print outs for the board members.

Micro-Grants (Excel spreadsheet attachment included)

- o Sady D. emailed/provided a handout containing micro-grant information for school liaisons to share with their designated Sunrise schools. Sady D. encouraged the EAB to walk their schools through the application (since they fairly simple to apply) and stated she is more than happy to assist with the application process (please make an appointment with a 1 to 2-week notice).
- *Please Note: EAB members can walk their school's designated staff member through the grant application process but the EAB member cannot apply on the school's behalf. Note schools are much more equipped to input their school data pertaining to the qualifying grant because they have all the appropriate information and are responsible for reporting how the grant is being utilized.
