While I was in my vehicle completing the proper paperwork before going to BSO Main Jail: the subject began to yell obscenities, hit his head against the cage, kicked the passenger back door of my marked patrol unit #304 and asking units to "kill him". The subject was advised that hobbles were going to be placed on his legs due to his actions. The subject knowingly and willingly refused to exit my marked vehicle after units on scene gave him multiple commands to do so.</p>		
<p>Units were forced to physically remove the subject from the back of the vehicle. During the altercation, the subject slipped one of his hands out of his handcuffs and units attempted to re-gain control of the subject. While attempting to gain control of the defendant, he began to brace, tense, pull and actively resist multiple units.</p>

At that time, he was guided to the floor by units in order to be re-cuffed and he continued to resist. The subject began to flail his arms which caused units lose the grip on his arms multiple times. He also flailed his legs in an attempt to avoid the hobbles being placed on his legs. His actions caused minor injuries to officers on scene. [REDACTED] obtained a small laceration to his right wrist and [REDACTED] was hit in the right tricep area with the loose cuff that the subject had in his hand. All units on scene had minor scrapes and redness to their knees). The subject then placed his arms under his body while we were on the ground in order to avoid being handcuffed. He was given several commands to stop resisting by multiple officers that were involved in the altercation; the defendant continued to resist.

While on the ground the subject stated that we were not going to place the hobbles on him. He continued to ask units to kill him and demanded to be let go. The subject also grabbed the cuff that was off of his wrist and units had to pry it from out of his hand. During the altercation, I delivered 2-3 strikes to the subject's shoulder area in order to gain compliance. The subject ultimately complied and was handcuffed and the hobbles were placed on his legs. He was placed back in the vehicle and he then escaped from the hobbles.

Sunrise Fire Rescue 39 responded to the scene due to the defendant escaping from the hobbles and he continued to be combative in the back of my vehicle. While in the back of the rescue truck he stated "Ya'll see what ya'll did to me" and lifted his knee. The cause of the subject's knee pain was due to him actively resisting units.

There was no bleeding to his knee and no further visible injuries.

He was transported to FMC and was medically cleared.

No officers required any medical assistance.

On 05/06/2022, I was dispatched to 6330 W. OAKLAND PARK BLVD (BRAVO SUPERMARKET) in reference to a physical altercation that was occurring between a male and a female in the parking lot. Before units arrived on scene the caller/witness [REDACTED] advised dispatched that the male and female walked to 6390 W. OAKLAND PARK BLVD (ADVANCED AUTOPARTS) and were still involved in a physical altercation.

A description was given for the victim and suspect. Units located both parties walking through the parking lot of Advanced Auto Parts. As units arrived on scene they were in a verbal altercation which stopped once they saw the marked patrol vehicles. Both parties were separated by units on scene; The victim who provided the name and DOB of "Jasmine Smith DOB 12/23/1999" stated that the defendant did not physically hit her. The subject who provided the name and DOB of "Nate Williams DOB 01/02/2022" stated that he only grabbed her by the arms to "calm her down".

Both parties stated that they have been dating for a few months.

While attempting to positively identify the victim and subject with the names they provided, I continued to receive negative results. At that time both were place in handcuffs until I was able to identify them and complete my investigation.

The subject provided a phone number which came back to a male named "Frank Southward". The driver's license picture that was displayed in FCIC/NCIC was obviously the subject. The subject then admitted to providing a false name to units on scene and apologized multiple times. The victim eventually provided her correct name and DOB which was [REDACTED]. She was also positively identified by her FL DL., Neither party had warrants.

Neither [REDACTED] or Frank could provide a current address he stated that they were homeless and living with a friend on and off, but did not know the address. An F.I that was completed by Lauderhill PD on 04/22/2022 stated that both subjects were found sleeping in a laundry mat:

Notes: Contact was made with [REDACTED] at the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] hanging out at the pool area and did not reside and was not visiting anyone.

Statements were taken from two separate independent witnesses (Stephanie Lopez and Suanny Munoz-Barrientos) who are employees of the Bravo Supermarket by Officer Jossfolk. Both witnesses stated that the subject was seen slapping the victim in the face with an open hand in addition to pulling the victims hair repeatedly. The witnesses stated that the subject continued to hit the victim and follow her as she attempted to walk away.

The victim did not want to pursue charges against the defendant; nor did she have any physical marks and bruises that I was able to observe.

The subject was transported to the East Substation before being transported to BSO Main Jail. While I was in my vehicle completing the proper paperwork before going to BSO Main Jail; the subject began to yell obscenities, hit his head against the cage, kicked the passenger back door of my marked patrol unit #304, and asking units to "kill him". The subject was advised that hobbles were going to be placed on his legs due to his actions. The subject knowingly and willingly refused to exit my mark vehicle after units on scene gave him multiple commands to do so. Units were forced to physically remove the subject from the back of the vehicle. I responded to 6330 W Oakland park Blvd as a back up officer. Upon arrival, Frank Southward and [REDACTED] were detained reference a domestic dispute. While Officer N. Williams was attempting to run an NCIC/FCIC check on both parties, Southward made mention that he has always given a false name before and he was used to doing that as a juvenile.

Shortly after, Southward was taken into custody for simple battery - domestic where he initially began acting erratic. Southward was transported to the Sunrise East Sub-station where I continued assisting Ofc. N. Williams.

Southward continued acting erratic in the back of the Sunrise Police marked patrol vehicle, while in handcuffs he began banging his head on the cage of the vehicle and kicking the door of the vehicle for several minutes. Southward was stating we should "kill him" instead of going to jail, he yelled profanity multiple times as he continued to kick and bang in the back of the vehicle. The decision was made to use hobbles in order to restrain Southward from further injury due to his actions.

While taking Southward out of the vehicle, he stated we would not place the hobbles on him, he immediately began tensing up and attempting to pull his legs away from the hobble restraint. Southward continued resisting by pulling away as I had a hold of his arm, we then immediately guided Southward to the ground in further attempt to restrain him.

Southward continued tensing and pulling from me as I had a hold of his arm which was still in cuffs, at some point he managed to get out of his handcuff while guiding him to the ground. In attempts to regain control of Southwards arm which he had the cuff around his wrist and in his hand in a tight hold, Southward continued flailing his arms and he strikes the tricep area of my arm. Myself and Ofc. Vargas regain control of his arm where shortly after he is placed in cuffs and hobble restraint.

Officers place him the back of the patrol vehicle again, where he continues acting erratic. The decision was made to call for Fire Rescue due to the possibility of injury and possible drug induced behavior before transporting to the main jail.

Southward was transported by Sunrise Rescue 39 to Florida Medical Center. No other involvement from this officer.

On 05/06/2022 at the Sunrise PD east substation (6800 Sunset Strip), I assisted Sunrise officers who had Frank Southward in custody. Southward was in the rear of Ofc. Smith's patrol vehicle attempting to use both of his legs to kick the rear passenger side door. Southward was using such force that the door began to slightly open. Fearing that Southward may cause permanent damage to the vehicle's frame or injure himself, officers decided to use hobble restraints on Southward.

Officers removed Southward from the patrol car and explained to him that the hobble restraints would be placed on his legs. Southward verbally refused and physically resisted (bracing, tensing, and pulling away) at which point I advised officers to take Southward to the ground so the hobble restraints could be applied. Southward continued to physically resist officers and disobey officers' verbal commands to "stop resisting." A minimal amount of force was used to gain compliance. The hobble restraints were eventually secured above Southward's knees and he was guided back to Ofc. Smith's patrol vehicle.

Once inside Ofc. Smith's patrol vehicle Southward began banging his head against the partition cage. Due to Southward's extremely erratic behavior and any injuries Southward may have sustained, officers decided to have Sunrise Fire-Rescue check Southward. Southward continued to bang his head against the cage during this time. It was determined that a medical clearance would be necessary. To prevent any injuries to Southward's head, Sunrise Fire Rescue 39 transported Southward to Florida Medical Center. Southward required leg restraints and a spit mask while riding with Fire Rescue to the hospital due to his erratic and aggressive behavior. Ofc. Jossfolk and I rode inside of the Fire Rescue truck accompanying Southward.

At Florida Medical Center, Southward continued his abrasive behavior and refused any medical attention from hospital staff. Southward was ultimately discharged from the hospital and transported to BSO Main Jail by Ofcs. Jossfolk and Smith.

SUPPLEMENT

SIMPLE- DOMESTIC BATTERY/ RESISITING WITH VIOLENCE

6330 W OAKLAND PARK BLVD

BWC ACTIVATED

I responded to 6330 W Oakland Park Blvd. as a back up officer to a domestic disturbance call. Upon my arrival on scene I observed numerous bystanders waving me in the direction of the altercation. When I rounded the corner, I observed a black male later identified as, Frank Southward and a black female later identified as [REDACTED] standing in the parking lot. It should be noted that Southward and [REDACTED] were the only people in the area. Contact was made with both subjects and the subjects were separated.

During the course of Ofc. N. Williams' investigation Southward stated to me numerous times that his name was "Nate". After all attempts failed to identify Southward he was given lawful commands to provide us his real name. Southward stated his name was Frank and that he had always provided a fake name to law enforcement. Once Ofc. Williams concluded her investigation Southward was arrested for simple domestic battery. Once placed in the marked police unit Southward became irate and pleaded with officers to let him go. Southward was transported to the east substation where officers stood by to assist Ofc. Williams with her paperwork.

Southward continued to act irate in the back of the police unit by banging his head on the cage, kicking the doors, and requesting officers "just kill him". After several minutes of this behavior officers decided to remove Southward from the vehicle and place him in a hobble to restrain his legs.

Once removed from the vehicle officers attempted to place Southward in the hobble. Southward stated "you are not putting that on me" and began to tense and pull his feet away from me as I attempted to place his feet in the hobble. Officers immediately guided Southward to the ground in an attempt to further restrain him. Once on the ground I was alerted by another officer that Southward had gotten his left hand free of the cuff and was holding it in his right hand. Southward continued tensing and began to flail his arms uncontrollably. Myself and [REDACTED] were able to gain control of his right hand containing the handcuffs. Shortly after Southward was restrained and placed back into the police unit. I contacted Sunrise Fire Rescue to respond to the scene as Southward continued to act irate and bang his head. Southward was restrained to a gurney and placed inside the Fire Rescue truck where he was transported off scene.

This concluded my involvement in this case.

SUPPLEMENT

6330 W OAKLAND PARK BLVD
BWC IN USE

On 05/06/2022, I responded to 6330 W Oakland Park Blvd to help assist Ofc. N. Williams in reference to a battery.

Upon arrival, I was informed by Ofc. N. Williams to go gather information from any witnesses to the incident. After gathering information from the two witnesses that saw the incident occur I relayed the information to Ofc. N. Williams, which led to the arrest of (SU) Frank Southward.

Both witnesses (WI) Stephanie Lopez and (WI) Suanny Munoz Barrientos stated they observed Southward and his girlfriend (VI) [REDACTED] in a verbal altercation in front of Bravo Supermarket that turned physical. Lopez and Munoz stated they observed Southward chasing [REDACTED] around the parking lot of the Supermarket aggressively pulling on [REDACTED] hair and open hand slapping her in the face multiple times. Both Lopez and Munoz's stories were exactly the same and both parties were interviewed separately.

Officers transported Southward to 6800 Sunset Strip (Sunrise PD East Sub Station) to finish paperwork and then transport Southward to BSO Main. While officers were at the east sub supervising Southward in the back of a marked patrol vehicle, Southward became irate and started kicking the back passenger door. At this point, Officers removed Southward from the marked unit to apply the hobble restraint to his legs to prevent him from kicking the door. As officers attempted to apply the hobble restraint, Southward refused to cooperate, became very irate, and started to physically resist. Southward began to push off the marked unit as well as tensing his body and doing anything he physically could to not be subdued. During this physical altercation, it was noticed by an officer that Southward slipped his cuffs and now had both hands free. Southward was then taken to the ground and physically restrained by multiple officers in order to gain compliance and custody of him. During the physical altercation, I was applying pressure to southwards back with my chest as well as pressure on his upper chest with my right forearm to prevent Southward from standing up or moving his torso. Once Southward was pinned flat on the ground, I gained full control over his left arm, extended it and pulled it behind his back, and placed him in handcuffs.

After gaining control of Southward and putting him back in handcuffs, he was then transported to Florida Medical Center (FMC) by Sunrise Fire Rescue. During Fire Rescue's transport, I rode in the back of the ambulance to assist if Southward became non-compliant again.

Once Southward was medically cleared from FMC, I assisted the Ofc. N. Williams with the transportation of Southward to BSO Main Jail to assure officer safety in case he chose to become non-compliant once again.
