<p>Sunrise Police Officers responded to 8521 NW 24th Place reference to a report of a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, Officers made contact with all parties involved and it was determined subject, [REDACTED] met Baker Act criteria. [REDACTED] Cleve Mark King and Karlene Elizabeth King, feared for their own safety as well as [REDACTED] safety due to his altered mental health due to previous drug use. [REDACTED] expressed the desire to kill himself due to current issues in his life.</p> <p>Upon being handcuffed and placed in the back of my vehicle (marked Sunrise Police unit 834), [REDACTED] became combative as I was attempting to close the rear driver door, kicking it back open with his feet. Officers warned [REDACTED] to stop but he ignored commands from Officers to stop and stay calm. While speaking to [REDACTED] he unbuckled the safety belt that was placed around the front of his chest.</p> <p>I removed [REDACTED] from the vehicle, placing him standing up with his chest towards my vehicle. As Sunrise Officer Fortune retrieved the hobble device from my vehicle, I could feel [REDACTED] wrapping his right leg around my right leg. At the same time, I could also feel [REDACTED] hands (my front was to his back) reaching and attempting to grab onto my police gear and the molle straps at the front of my outer vest carrier. One of the items grabbed onto was my flashlight, which he pulled off of my vest. I gave [REDACTED] clear loud verbal commands to stop</p>

reaching for items on my vest and to remove his right leg, which was wrapped around mine, but he ignored my lawful commands. Upon [REDACTED] ignoring my lawful commands, I escorted him to the ground.

As I tried controlling [REDACTED] on the ground and Officer Fortune attempted to restrain his legs using the hobble device, he continued to ignore our verbal commands to stop and comply. [REDACTED] was on his back, attempting to sit up and I could feel him tensing his body to push back on my attempts to control him. At the same time, he was kicking his feet in an attempt to prevent Officer Fortune from applying the hobble device to control his foot movement. Again loud clear verbal commands were given to [REDACTED] to stop and comply, all of them were ignored by him.

As I tried to roll [REDACTED] on his side in an attempt to gain better control of him, he continued to kick his feet and use his body weight against me. While giving verbal commands to stop resisting Officers, I could feel [REDACTED] grabbing at my left wrist and my watch as if he was attempting to control my hands. I instructed [REDACTED] to stop resisting my efforts to gain control or he would be punched in order to gain compliance. Again, [REDACTED] ignored our commands to stop, and continued to grab and hold onto my left wrist and watch. It was at this time I punched [REDACTED] with a closed fist to the right side of his face. After I struck [REDACTED] once, he immediately stopped tensing, kicking and released my wrist.

The hobble device was applied to [REDACTED] feet and he was placed in the recovery position (on his left side) until additional Sunrise Officers arrived. Once additional Sunrise Officers arrived, [REDACTED] was escorted back into my vehicle and secured without further incident.

It should be noted that even though [REDACTED] was handcuffed at the time of the physical altercation, due to his slim built and flexibility he was able to easily maneuver his hands to his sides and to the front of his body. Also, with [REDACTED] continuously kicking his feet as Officers were trying to apply the hobble device, I feared myself or Officer Fortune could have been kicked and/or injured by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] suffered some swelling around his right eye and two small light lacerations under his bottom right eye lid.

[REDACTED] was transported to FMC due to being baker acted and to receive any medical treatment for the minor injuries suffered to his right eye.

Sunrise PD Sergeant D. Rodriguez was notified of the use of force and made contact with [REDACTED] at FMC. Photographs of [REDACTED] and his right eye were taken and attached to the report.

On 05/29/2022 I responded to 8521 NW 24th Place in reference to Cleve King (RP) advising [REDACTED] (IO), to be aggressive and acting abnormally.

Cleve stated he was worried for [REDACTED] due to [REDACTED] prior drug use and stating he wanted to kill himself. Cleve observed [REDACTED] going outside the residence with a \$20.00 bill in his hand to possibly buy drugs. [REDACTED] Karlene King (IO2), observed a dark-colored vehicle in front [REDACTED] with two black male occupants inside. Karlene left [REDACTED] to make contact with the vehicle to which the driver drove away at a high rate of speed. The make and model of the vehicle are unknown. Cleve and Karlene confronted [REDACTED] about the vehicle accusing him of attempting to buy drugs due to his history of drug use. [REDACTED] became upset and told [REDACTED] he wanted to kill himself.

Upon my arrival, officers observed [REDACTED] in his room dazed and confused. [REDACTED] was asked several questions in reference to his well-being to which he mumbled his words, responded in none relative statements, and also remained silent at times. [REDACTED] stated he did tell [REDACTED] he wanted to kill himself due to being "tired of everything". [REDACTED] was observed to not be in the proper state of mind exhibiting signs of drug-induced psychosis and a none diagnosed mental disorder such as schizophrenia. [REDACTED] stated he does have prior drug use of LSD, mushrooms, and Marijuana. At this time, [REDACTED] was detained to be baker acted.

While placing the cuffs on [REDACTED] he resisted by bracing, tensing, and pulling his arms away from the officers. Due to his small wrists, he was able to slip his right handcuff off while being escorted to the marked patrol vehicle. [REDACTED] was handcuffed and placed into Officer [REDACTED] marked patrol vehicle in the rear driver-side seat. [REDACTED] seat belt was placed on him and as we closed his door he stopped it from closing with his left foot. [REDACTED] also tried to unbuckle his seat belt and was advised by Officer [REDACTED] and myself to not block the door. It should be noted, due to [REDACTED] slim build and flexibility he was able to easily maneuver his hands to his sides and to the front of his body. [REDACTED] was readvised he is not under arrest and will be baker acted for his safety and well-being. An attempt was made again to close the door but [REDACTED] blocked it with the same foot and unbuckled his seat belt with his hands. Officer [REDACTED] then took [REDACTED] out of the vehicle placing him against the rear driver-side fender in the upright position while I obtained the department-issued leg restraints. As Officer [REDACTED] waited for the leg restraints, [REDACTED] began to grab items from his vest, housing various non-lethal equipment. [REDACTED] wrapped his right leg around Officer [REDACTED] leg and successfully removed his flashlight from his vest. Officer [REDACTED] then escorted [REDACTED] to the ground (in the grass) to prevent him from obtaining any lethal or non-lethal equipment.

While on the ground, [REDACTED] continued to resist by grabbing Officer [REDACTED] s wrist. [REDACTED] was also kicking with both of his legs as I attempted to place the leg restraints on him. Officer [REDACTED] and I repeatedly advised [REDACTED] to stop resisting and stop kicking. Officer [REDACTED] instructed [REDACTED] to stop grabbing him and let go of his wrist. [REDACTED] refused to listen to the officer's commands to which Officer [REDACTED] did a jab to the right side of [REDACTED] face to stop him from resisting and grabbing Officer [REDACTED] s. [REDACTED] stopped grabbing Officer [REDACTED] after being struck once and remained on the ground in the recovery position until additional officer's arrived on scene. After the additional officer's arrival, [REDACTED] was safely placed into the patrol vehicle with leg restraints attached.

Due to [REDACTED] admitting he is having suicidal thoughts, it was determined without proper care or treatment he would

be a harm to himself or others. Officer [REDACTED] and I transported [REDACTED] to Florida Medical Center where he was baker acted without further incident.
