<p>At approximately 1812 hours on 08/20/2022, Officers responded to [REDACTED] for a welfare check on a male who had possibly attacked family members and was experiencing a mental health crisis. Officers arrived on scene and spoke to the Aunt of the subject, Jen Stanley, who advised the subject inside the home had threatened the caretaker earlier in the day and then tried to attack her and his mother, [REDACTED] right before officers arrived. She stated he has low functioning autism and was off of his medications. Officers went into the home and found the subject to be located in a bathroom. He sounded like he was humming and pacing back and forth. Officers opened the door and located the subject. We tried to verbally convince the subject to exit the bathroom to detain him for the Baker Act. He became physically combative and braced his body while tensing his arms. He was taken to the floor where he continued to try and bite and kick officers while resisting our lawful efforts to place him in handcuffs. After multiple failed attempts to get his hands behind his back due to his active resistance, I deployed one taser cartridge to the lower half of his back. Only 1 probe remained in the subject and a second cartridge was deployed. After the second taser cartridge deployment, we were able to gain physical control of the subject and place him in handcuffs. He was later transported to Cleveland Clinic for medical clearance and to be admitted under the Baker Act.</p>

### Narrative - continued

It should be noted that all officers who had met with [REDACTED] were wearing Class B uniforms. All uniforms displayed departmental insignia and police badges.

At the conclusion of the incident, Officers elected not to charge [REDACTED] with Resisting Law Enforcement with Violence and Battery on a Law Enforcement Officer since he was clearly experiencing a mental health crisis.

The BWC was active on all officers engaged in the incident.

- The subject braced and tensed his arms and body, failing to put his hands behind his back.

-He actively kicked, clawed at, and bit officers who tried to detain him.

On 08/20/2022, I responded to a welfare check at [REDACTED]. The reportee called the police and asked that we check on his mother and his aunt while also evaluating his cousin who was experiencing a mental health crisis. The reportee stated his cousin, (IO) [REDACTED] had previously threatened his mother and the caregiver earlier in the day. The reportee followed up by saying [REDACTED] was actively becoming more irate and violent towards his mother and other family members as he was on the phone with law enforcement.

Upon arrival, we met with (IO) Jane Stanley down the street from the home. Jane is the Aunt of [REDACTED]. She walked us to the door and explained [REDACTED] has low-functioning autism and chased the caregiver and other family members around the home with a knife earlier in the day. She believed the medication he is prescribed is not working which is causing him to have a mental health crisis. It should be noted that [REDACTED] left the line of sight of everyone and it was unknown to officers if he regained possession of the knife or any other weapons.

Officers went up the stairs to speak with [REDACTED]. He could be heard inside the bathroom pacing back and forth and humming. When the door was opened, he had a dazed look on his eyes. He appeared to be in an animated state of mind. Officers went to detain [REDACTED] and he physically resisted their lawful efforts to detain him. He tensed his arms and physically fought to keep his arms from going behind his back. He was taken to the floor where he continued to fight officers. [REDACTED] kicked officers and bit one of them in the wrist. [REDACTED] was not able to comprehend that officers were there to assist him. After struggling for several minutes, Officer [REDACTED] deployed his taser in an effort to gain compliance from [REDACTED]. The Taser strike was effective and he was subsequently detained. [REDACTED] was walked down the stairs and placed in a patrol vehicle while Fire Rescue units responded to the scene.

I then spoke with (IO) [REDACTED] who advised the following: At approximately 1715 hours [REDACTED]'s Caretaker, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were in the home with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] is [REDACTED]'s biological mother. [REDACTED] stated she saw a change in [REDACTED]'s behavior which she attributed to the medication that he took. [REDACTED] advised as she and [REDACTED] were in the home with [REDACTED] he began exhibiting violent behavior toward [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] grabbed her arms and legs and forcefully squeezed them until visible marks were left on her arm, and a cut was left on her left calf. [REDACTED] intervened and got [REDACTED] off of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] then advised [REDACTED] got hold of a knife and proceeded to go toward [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. At this time, [REDACTED] exited the home with [REDACTED] and locked [REDACTED] inside. Jan was contacted by phone and was able to get [REDACTED] to put the knife away. Shortly after, officers showed up on scene. [REDACTED] stated she does not believe the incident with the knife or the incident where he grabbed her legs was intentional by [REDACTED] and attributes his actions to his mental health crisis. Attempts to contact the caretaker, [REDACTED] were met with negative results to find out her thoughts on the incident prior to officers' arrival.

[REDACTED] was evaluated at the scene by Sunrise Fire Rescue #83. [REDACTED] was then transported to Cleveland Clinic in Weston. Ofc. Deweese and [REDACTED] rode with rescue as [REDACTED] was being transported.

Based on the circumstances of the case, [REDACTED] was unable to determine for himself whether a mental health examination was necessary. It is this Officer's belief that without care or treatment, there was a substantial likelihood that [REDACTED] would cause serious bodily harm to himself and others. He was subsequently admitted under the Baker Act to Cleveland Clinic. Dr. Hirsh (B# 511 846) collected the required paperwork and [REDACTED] was released to the staff at Cleveland Clinic.

On 08/20/2022, I responded to a welfare check at [Redacted]. The reportee called the police and asked that we check on his mother and his aunt while also evaluating his cousin who was experiencing a mental health crisis. The reportee stated his cousin, (IO) [Redacted] had previously threatened his mother and the caregiver earlier in the day. The reportee followed up by saying [Redacted] was actively becoming more irate and violent towards his mother and other family members as he was on the phone with law enforcement.

Upon arrival, we met with (IO) Jane Stanley down the street from the home. Jane is the Aunt of [Redacted]. She walked us to the door and explained [Redacted] has low-functioning autism and chased the caregiver and other family members around the home with a knife earlier in the day. She believed the medication he is prescribed is not working which is causing him to have a mental health crisis. It should be noted that [Redacted] left the line of sight of everyone and it was unknown to officers if he regained possession of the knife or any other weapons.

Officers went up the stairs to speak with [Redacted]. He could be heard inside the bathroom pacing back and forth and humming. When the door was opened, he had a dazed look on his eyes. He appeared to be in an animated state of mind. Officers went to detain [Redacted] and he physically resisted our lawful efforts to detain him.

[Redacted] tensed his arms and physically fought to keep his arms from going behind his back. He was taken to the floor where he continued to fight officers. [Redacted] kicked Officers [Redacted] and [Redacted] and bit me in the left wrist. [Redacted] was not able to comprehend that Officers were there to assist him and he continued to be physically and verbally defiant.

Officers could not physically restrain [Redacted] due to his strength. After minutes of struggling with [Redacted] I could tell he was not losing energy and was still able to actively resist our lawful detention efforts. I deployed my taser in an effort to gain compliance from [Redacted] and to prevent Officers from being injured from his continued resistance. The first Taser deployment struck him in the center of the back. One probe failed to stay in place, thus defeating the effectiveness of the deployment. I deployed a second Taser cartridge in [Redacted]s lower back. At this point, he became temporarily incapacitated which allowed for Officers to safely place him in handcuffs. He then began to comply with Officers and agreed to walk down the stairs to go to the hospital.

Fire Rescue was immediately requested and [Redacted] was transported to Cleveland Clinic for both treatment for the tasing and to be admitted under the Baker Act. (See Officer [Redacted]s report for further information). Sergeant McGovern responded to the scene. A Response to Resistance and C.E.W. form was submitted for the Taser deployment. The probes were later entered into evidence in accordance with policy and procedure. Pictures of the probe contact in [Redacted]s back were submitted to Evidence.com. Sergeant McGovern issued me two new taser cartridges and submitted the issuance form to the Training Unit. Nothing further.
