

I then spoke with (IO) who advised the following: At approximately 1715 hours were in the home with is biological mother. stated she saw a change in s behavior which she attributed to the medication that he took. advised as she and he began exhibiting violent behavior toward advised grabbed her arms and legs home with and forcefully squeezed them until visible marks were left on her arm, and a cut was left on her left calf. intervened and got off of then advised got hold of a knife and proceeded to go toward At this time, exited the home with and locked inside. Jan was contacted by phone to put the knife away. Shortly after, officers showed up on scene. and was able to get believe the incident with the knife or the incident where he grabbed her legs was intentional by his actions to his mental health crisis. Attempts to contact the caretaker, were met with negative results to find out her thoughts on the incident prior to officers' arrival. was evaluated at the scene by Sunrise Fire Rescue #83. was then transported to Cleveland Clinic in Weston. Ofc. Deweese and rode with rescue as was being transported. Based on the circumstances of the case, was unable to determine for himself whether a mental health examination was necessary. It is this Officer's belief that without care or treatment, there was a substantial likelihood would cause serious bodily harm to himself and others. He was subsequently admitted under the Baker Act to Cleveland Clinic. Dr. Hirsh (B# 511 846) collected the required paperwork and was released to the staff at Cleveland Clinic.

He was taken to the floor where he continued to fight officers. kicked Officers and and bit me in the left wrist. not able to comprehend that Officers were there to assist him and he continued to be physically and verbally defiant. Officers could not physically restrain due to his strength. After minutes of struggling with he was not losing energy and was still able to actively resist our lawful detention efforts. I deployed my taser in an effort to gain compliance from and to prevent Officers from being injured from his continued resistance. The first Taser deployment struck him in the center of the back. One probe failed to stay in place, thus defeating the effectiveness of the deployment. I deployed a second Taser cartridge in solver back. At this point, he became temporarily incapacitated which allowed for Officers to safely place him in handcuffs. He then began to comply with Officers and agreed to walk down the stairs to go to the hospital. Fire Rescue was immediately requested and was transported to Cleveland Clinic for both treatment for the tasing and to be admitted under the Baker Act. (See Officer s report for further information). Sergeant McGovern responded to the scene. A Response to Resistance and C.E.W. form was submitted for the Taser deployment. The probes were later entered into evidence in accordance with policy and procedure. Pictures of the probe contact in s back were submitted to Evidence.com. Sergeant McGovern issued me two new taser cartridges and submitted the issuance form to the Training Unit. Nothing further.
