Open Discussion: Updates/Announcements Regarding Schools

- Stacy S.: Bair Middle (a) Oct. 6 Mentoring Tomorrow's Leaders (MTL). (b) Oct. 17 The school will host a Hispanic Heritage Program. (c) Oct. 19 The school will hold a National Honor Society induction ceremony. (d) Oct 31 there will be a parent and teacher association dance. (e) Students received the iPad from the Verizon Innovative Learning Grant.
- Dr. Rolle: Sandpiper Elementary (a) The school will have a competition and give out prizes to student. School is requesting donations for the prizes.
