Summary Minutes

Call Meeting to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

- The meeting was called to order by Erncy D. (EAB Chair) and the Pledge of Allegiance was observed.

Approval of EAB Summary Minutes

- Stacy S. made a motion to approve M11 meeting minutes from November 1, 2022. Lindsay O. second the motion, with a small edit on her last name. There was no opposition from the EAB.

Open Discussion: Updates/Announcements Regarding Schools

- **Stacy S.:** Bair Middle - (a) Dec. 6 - 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm: Parent University – an opportunity to help parents navigate tools/information/resources at the school. (b) Dec. 10 - 10:00 am to 1:00pm: iPad Distribution for students grades 6th – 8th via the [Verizon Innovative Learning Grant](#). (c) The Media Center renovation is almost complete. (d) Dec. 13 – 5pm to 7pm: Middle School Magnet Showcase – the program is open to students and parents throughout the district. (e) Saturday Day School for 8th graders who need tutoring in Math and Science classes.
- **Dr. Rolle:** Sandpiper Elementary - (a) Dr. Rolle met with [Assistant Principal Maximo Castillo](#) to walk through the concept of the giving tree. The school partnered with non-profit [Kids in Distress](#) who donated gifts to the students. The second partnership came from parents/visitors who wanted to the giving tree. Dr. Rolle was able to purchase a few Giving Tree tags and purchased gifts as a way to give back during the holiday season.
- **Gessika M.:** Sawgrass Elementary - (a) The school hosted a Father + Daughter Dance, where 400 dads and daughters attended. (b) Students are taking multiple assessment test prior to the New Year. (c) The Accountability Funds for the school were voted on. When a school scores an A or goes up a grade level (D to C, C to B), the state grants the school funding. (d) The Panther Prowl is an event that involves student, parents, and community members. Students in 4th and 5th grade participate in a 2-mile run, while students

in 1st, 2nd and 3rd run a one (1) mile course. This is a PTA sponsored event and it is currently in the planning stages.

- **Lindsay O.:** Lindsay O. discussed a few points about Franklin Academy (although it is not her home school but she is a teacher there). She stated Franklin Academy will be receiving a program called PAPER in January 2023. This will be a free one-one unlimited tutoring service. Students will have access to this program at anytime to assist with any trouble they are having. This will be Lindsey O. last meeting. She stated she has been on the board for 7 years and wants to focus her attention to other youth education endeavors.
- **Aldett F.:** Village Elementary - (a) Aldett F. attended the volunteer breakfast (b) Village is asking for volunteers to read to students for 30 minutes. This will be an opportunity for students to expand within language arts.

Old Business:

(a) Outstanding Citizenship Scholarship: Broward Education Foundation (BEF)

New Business:

(a) Event: Sunrise Arts Festival/Winter Wonderland (12/10/22 – 10 am to 4pm - Santa On Site 10am to 1pm); Admission: Free for Festival; \$5 for kids 12 and under participating in Winter Wonderland.

(b) Parent Family Engagement Plan – Franklin Academy & Banyan Elementary: The EAB received copies of the Parent Family Engagement Plan for Franklin Academy, Welleby Elementary, Village Elementary and Banyan Elementary.

(c) SPEAKER – Michael Cuminale, Recreation Specialist (City of Sunrise – Leisure Services Department): Michael C. explained the various youth programs available through the Youth Athletics. These programs include Soccer, Basketball, Baseball/Softball, and Flag Football/Cheerleading. There are 700 + youth athletes, led by 80 head coach. These programs are open to both residents and non-residents (additional costs). There is a fee waiver for residents. The parents apply for to assistance, in order to cover with the cost of programs. Parents that are interested in coaching receive 50% off of the registration fee. For Sunrise residents only, if you apply, you will receive a \$50 Dicks Sporting Good gift card. Start Smart program begins from age 3 to 5 (with the exception of flag football). The instructional programs start at age 6.
