#### **Summary Minutes**

# Open Discussion: Updates/Announcements Regarding Schools

- Carolyn H.: Banyan Elementary (a) Carolyn spoke with Principal Neunie and they are preparing for their midyear assessment. (b) Family Science Night – January 18, 2023. (c) Breakfast/lunch will be served to First Responders – February 14, 2023.
- Natalia A.: Horizon Elementary (a) Horizon is working on completing their Media Center. Natalia shared the recommendations from the EAB to Principal Smith, on reaching out to local high school students for community service hours to complete the Media Center mural project. Natalia reached out to PTA parents with a painting background and one parent has committed to assist with the mural. (b) The school is currently gearing up for the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. (c) City Commission recognized a Horizon teacher for Teacher of the Month at the December 2022 Commission Meeting. Additionally, Natalia inquired about the Cambridge presentation hosted at Piper High and the library NOT having books. Sady will follow-up with Lourdes Lawrence and Meryl Girard, since Mayor Ryan spoke directly to Mrs. Hautigan during a Commission Meeting. Natalia suggested to host the American Federation of Teachers Reading Opens the World initiative, which focuses on donating books to schools.
- Dr. Carolyn S.: Discovery Elementary (a) Assessments have been successfully completed. The students and staff are working on a target curriculum to ensure that standards met/mastered.
