Summary Minutes

Call Meeting to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

Pierreline M.: Welleby Elementary – Pierreline met with the Principal and explained that Welleby Elementary is facing challenges with attendance.

Aldett F.: Village Elementary – (Feb 1) Math Night was very successful and is in the process of moving forward with adding the Cambridge Program.

Carolyn H: Banyan Elementary – (Feb 10) Valentine's Day dance (200+ people to attend).

Natalia A: Natalia provided Principal Hautigan the information for the Teachers grant to fund books for the Media Center.

Scholarship Plug (15 minutes):

The Scholarship Plug is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit initiative that offers concierge planning services by coaching students to obtain college scholarships. Carrie Kasher, City of Sunrise – Sustainability Officer (15 minutes)

Carrie introduced herself to the EAB and provided information on the Stainability Action Plan. The Sustainability Action Plan (SAP) is intended to serve as a guide measure performance over time. The Sunrise SAP includes 18 goals, 94 recommendations broken down, and three SAP Focuses Areas (Resource Management, Vulnerability and Sustainability). Engagement is done through community events, school events, and special activities.

P3 Eco-Challenge: Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) P3 Eco-Challenge recognizes/awards BCPS schools, teachers, students, non-instructional and custodial staff for their efforts to learn about and implement environmentally sustainable measures within their schools/communities.

Be a Butterfly Hero: Our Be A Butterfly Hero Program advances those goals by supporting biodiversity and habitat. By encouraging the planting of native habitat gardens, provide vital natural connective corridors and important food sources for our other local species (bees, butterflies, birds, and burrowing owls). Eleven (11) schools are certified Wild Life Habitat. Carrie does have a small budget for BCPS in Sunrise that are interested in establishing a butterfly garden. There will need to be a School Administrator/Lead to maintain the garden.

Adapt a Street Program: The City of Sunrise encourages local businesses, neighbors and organizations to Adopt-A-Street to enhance the appearance of our community and beautify our roadways. In return for "adopting" a half-mile or longer segment of a street and agreeing to pick up litter at least four times per year over a two-year period, a sign will be installed to provide your group with recognition for their commitment to stewardship. Broward County provides the gloves, safety vest, liter pickers etc.

Drop Saver Poster Contest: Sunrise Utilities collects student posters within our Utility Service Area schools including Sunrise, Davie, Weston and Southwest Ranches. A winner from each division is selected by the judging panel based on creativity, clarity of conservation message, use of theme, and originality. The winning poster in each division is sent to the Florida Section of the American Water Works Association to compete at the state level.

Sunrise BioBlitz: It gives the public an opportunity to contribute to a genuine scientific survey. The benefit of using iNaturalist is that when you upload an observation it will suggest an identification, and it allows the iNaturalist community to then confirm or suggest corrections. The BioBlitz is a great way to connect residents to nature and advance sustainable and resilient open spaces that support people and wildlife!

Carrie asked the EAB to think about: (a) Are these sustainable programs valuable to Sunrise Schools? (b) What can the City do to help encourage schools to get more involved with these programs?

Dr. Stewart explained that the administrative group can be perceived as being left out by the way the form is written.

Meeting Adjourned: Erncy D. made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Dr. Stewart Seconded the motion. There was no opposition from the EAB.
