Black History Month 2024

WHEREAS, Black History Month, celebrated during the month of February, originated in 1926 when Dr. Carter G. Woodson set aside a special period in February to recognize the heritage and achievements of Black people in the United States; and

WHEREAS, in 1986 Congress passed Public Law 99-244 which designated February 1986 as "National Black (Afro-American) History Month." The law directed the President to issue a proclamation calling on the people of the United States to observe February 1986 with the appropriate ceremonies and activities. Black History Month has since been an annual national celebration of achievements by African Americans and their central role in U.S. history; and

WHEREAS, since 1976, every American president has designated February as Black History Month and endorsed a specific theme. The Black History Month 2024 theme is – "African American and the Arts." We especially recognize those African American artists - poets, writers, visual artists, actors and dancers who have historically served as change agents through their crafts and uplift the race, speak truth to power and inspire a nation through their "Arts of resistance;" and

WHEREAS, consistent with this theme we recall sculptor Edmonia "Wildfire" Lewis, Poets like Langston Hughes and Josephine Baker. Painters such as Aaron Douglas a leading figure in the Harlem Renaissance. Musicians ranging from Muddy Waters and BB King to Nina Simone and DJ "Kool Herc". Dancers like Alvin Ailey, movie stars like Sidney Poitier and Denzel Washington who have all been pioneers in their fields, representing the best of black culture and its influence on American and the World; and

WHEREAS, the year 2024 beckons introspection on the profound history and teachings of African Americans, urging society to focus on the evolution, prosperity, and diversity of African American achievements; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sunrise, recognizes that the soul of America is what makes us unique among all nations. We are the only country in the world founded on an idea. It is the idea that we are all created equal and deserve to be treated with equal dignity throughout our lives. While we still grapple today with the moral stain and vestiges of slavery — our country's original sin — we have never walked away from the fight to fully realize the promise of America for all Americans. Throughout our history, Black Americans have never given up on the promise of America; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission of the City of Sunrise recognize the importance of commemorating Black History Month. In doing so, we pay homage to and acknowledge the achievements of African Americans throughout our Nation's history and encourage the continuation of its celebration to raise the awareness of this community's accomplishments for all Americans.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that I, Michael J. Ryan, Mayor of the City of Sunrise, Florida, together with the City Commissioners do hereby proclaim the month of February 2024 as: **Black History Month** in the City of Sunrise and encourage all to celebrate our diverse heritage and culture, and continue our efforts to create a world that is more just, peaceful, and prosperous for all.
