Ilex cassine

Height: 20-30 feet

Plant in Full Sun to Partial Shade

Florida Native Tree

Red fruit eaten by birds

Special Consideration(s): Does best in moist soils; if plant in a dry area may need irrigation or supplemental watering.

Pigeon Plum

Coccoloba diversifolia

Height: 30-40 feet

Plant in Full Sun to Partial Shade

Narrow crown good for between houses
or entryways

Purple fruit eaten by birds

Blooms year round; Nectar for butterflies

Fiddlewood

Citharexylum spinosum

Small-sized Tree, 12-25 feet

Plant in Full Sun

Fragrant flowers; butterfly nectar source

Birds eat orange fruit

Special Consideration(s): Naturally multi-stemmed; to form a tree, stems must be continually reduced until one trunk is formed.

Firebush

Hamelia patens

Height: Up to 20 feet

Plant in Full Sun to Partial Sun

Plant in full sign for more flowers

Wildlife-Friendly Rockstar!

Special Consideration(s): Can be trimmed to keep as a shrub. Can be grown in a large container/planter.

Thatch Palm

Thrinax radiata

Height: 15-30 feet

Plant in Full Sun to Partial Shade

Hurricane Wind Resistant

Nesting site and food source for birds

Special Consideration(s): Slow growing, endangered species. Can be grown in a large container/planter.

Mango

“Nam Doc Mai”

Height 10-15 feet

Plant in Full Sun

Ripens June to July

Flavor: Sweet, Tropical

Texture: Smooth, No Fiber

Mango

“Honey Kiss”

Height up to 10 feet

Plant in Full Sun

Ripens July to August

Flavor: Classic, Sweet Honey

Texture: Smooth, No Fiber

Lychee

Height: 30-50 feet (over 30 years)

Plant in Full Sun

Fruits from late June to July

Ready to pick when outer surface turns strawberry red and becomes brittle

Special Consideration(s): Lychee erinose mite is a pest of lychee fruit trees





Avocado

“Winter Mexican”

Height up to 40 feet

Plant in Full Sun/Partial Sun

Ripens October to November, pick when
fruit has transitioned to a deep-purple

Rich and Creamy, Mild Flavor (30% Oil)

Fruit Size: Small to Medium
