Subject's Resistance Type of resistance used by subject In this situation, the subjects were two pit bull dogs. The dogs responded initially from my immediate proximity when I told them to "go home," walking away from me. Both dogs then simultaneously turned around and aggressively charged at me with no indication that they were going to slow down; it was apparent to me that their intention was to attack me. They never ceased their charge at me, ultimately making physical contact with me (although I was able to defend myself from being bitten). <p>At 2147hrs on 2/1/24 a call was received from a passerby of two pit bull dogs walking around the area of NW 115 Terr and NW 44 St. The caller stated that the dogs had collars on, but he could not see tags. I responded to the area at 2157hrs and made contact with the caller who advised he had last seen the dogs walking north towards NW 45 PL. I told the caller I would drive through the area to check for the dogs.</p>			
<p>As I was backing out onto NW 115 Terr the caller began yelling at me, telling me that the dogs had come back and were walking behind my car. I then exited my vehicle and was in close proximity to the dogs: both pit bull type dogs, one brown one and one that was white and brown. The dogs began barking at me and acting somewhat apprehensive but did not at the time appear to be overtly aggressive. To try to calm the dogs down, I spoke to them, asking them if "they lived around here." When I said this, they both began walking north on NW 115 Terr, as if they recognized that their home was close by. I then continued to tell them to go home, with it appearing that this may have been what they intended to do, responding initially so acutely to my commands.</p>			








<p>Once the dogs had crossed NW 115 Terr, they began to walk towards the south side of the canal on the east side of the road. I continued to tell them to go home at which time both dogs turned around and aggressively ran towards me, shoulder to shoulder while barking at me. It no longer appeared that the dogs were friendly, and it was apparent that their intent was to attack me. I waited until the dogs were within biting range when I kicked one of them to create distance, knowing now that their intent was to bite me. The fully brown dog then began to move to my right side. Knowing that I could not fight off an attack from both dogs if I was being flanked by one of them, I recognized that my only option was to shoot the dog that was trying to get behind me. I fired three rounds from my department issued handgun, believing that I had struck the brown dog. This was enough to scare the brown and white dog away, running north into the neighborhood. The brown dog ran south. I advised over the radio that I had shot the dog and was then approached by a driver who was heading north on NW 115 Terr, asking me if I had shot the dog and informing me that it had died in the road.</p>	
<p>The dog was located deceased on the east side of the road. I observed that I had struck the dog with two of the rounds I had fired, with one going through its front left paw and another going directly through the center mass of its body. The third round was later located where I had shot at the dog; it struck the pavement, mushroomed, and came to rest close to where it struck the pavement, therefore all shots were accounted for.</p>	
<p>CID was notified and CSI Lardin responded to document the scene.</p>	
<p>After all crime scene processing was complete, the dog was scanned for a microchip, yielding negative results. No contact was established with an owner.</p>	
<p>Due to one dangerous dog getting away and entering the neighborhood, I notified Bravo Shift supervisors for officer / community safety purposes. Additionally I issued an extra watch, for the same reasons.</p>

Police Information - Shooting of Aggressive Pit Bull

BWC Active

At 2147hrs on 2/1/24 a call was received from a passerby (Lyle 954-328-3851) of two white and brown pit bull dogs walking around the area of NW 115 Terr and NW 44 St. The caller stated that the dogs had collars on, but he could not see tags. I responded to the area at 2157hrs and made contact with the caller who was at the entrance in the northernmost parking lot of SAC Park off of NW 115 Terr. The caller advised he had last seen the dogs walking north towards NW 45 PL. I told the caller I would drive through the area to check for the dogs.

As I was backing out onto NW 115 Terr the caller began yelling at me to get my attention, telling me that the dogs had come back and were walking behind my car. I then exited my vehicle and was in close proximity to the dogs; both pit bull type dogs, one brown one and one that was white and brown. As I was making contact with the dogs, the caller left the area.

Upon exiting my vehicle, the dogs began barking at me and acting somewhat apprehensive but did not at the time appear to be overtly aggressive. To try to calm the dogs down, I spoke to them, asking them if "they lived around here" and asking them "where their home was." When I said this, they both began walking north on NW 115 Terr, as if they recognized the word "home" and that their home was close by. I then continued to tell them to go home, with it appearing that this may have been what they intended to do, responding initially so acutely to my commands.

Once the dogs had crossed NW 115 Terr, they began to walk towards the south side of the canal on the east side of the road. I continued to tell them to go home at which time both dogs spontaneously turned around and aggressively ran towards me, shoulder to shoulder while barking at me. It no longer appeared that the dogs were friendly, and it was apparent that their intent was to attack me. I waited until the dogs were within biting range when I kicked one of them to create distance, knowing now that their intent was to bite me. The fully brown dog then began to move to my right side. Knowing that I could not fight off an attack from both dogs if I was being flanked by one of them, I recognized that my only option was to shoot the dog that was trying to get behind me. The third round was later located where I had shot at the dog; it struck the pavement, mushroomed, and came to rest close to where it struck the pavement, therefore all shots were accounted for.

CID was notified and CSI Lardin responded to document the scene.

After all crime scene processing was complete, the dog was scanned for a microchip, yielding negative results. No contact was established with an owner. The only identification present on the dog was the name "Minnie," insultingly scribbled with a Sharpie marker on the oversized collar that it was wearing. The dog was female and showed evidence of having previously had puppies.

With no owner identified, I contacted the Coral Springs Animal Hospital and spoke with Ashley. I was advised that the case would be considered a "good Samaritan" case, and that Coral Springs Animal Hospital would hold the dog for ten days before sending it for cremation.

Due to the fact that there was a likelihood that the dog lived in the area, I notified Bravo Shift supervisors of the incident, in the event that an owner called during the day to report a lost dog(s). Additionally, due to concern for officer safety and that of the community in regards to the aggressive dog that was still unaccounted for, I issued an extra watch for SAC Park and the surrounding area.

A Response to Resistance Report was completed prior to the conclusion of my shift and was submitted to Major Sweat, who responded to the scene of the incident after it occurred.

On 2/2/24 I was contacted by Ofc Carter who had reviewed my extra watch and believed that he had located the other dog that was involved. Ofc Carter provided me with a photo of the dog that he was in contact with and I was able to identify it as the second dog that attacked me. The dog was located in SAC Park. With just as little respect for this dog, the owner had failed to attach any proper identification to the dog, and had just as insultingly scribbled the name "Gucci" on this dogs collar as had been the case with "Minnie." Broward County Animal Control was contacted, responded and took this dog into their custody after a search for a microchip yielded negative results.

As of 2/7/24 I have not received any additional information regarding an owner of either dog.

Under penalties of perjury I declare that I have read the foregoing and that the facts stated therein are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.
