Gold Award

- The Gold Award is the highest award a girl scout can earn. It can only be achieved by Seniors and Ambassadors (9th to 12th grade). The Gold Award must touch on a problem in the community and create a solution for it.
- Requirements:
 - Must be a *Girl-Led* project, meaning the Girl Scout will use her leadership skills to lead the project
 - Must have at least 80 hours of work logged
 - Must create a lasting solution to a problem in the community
 - Must make a team full of experts and people of the community



Gold Award Incorporation

- The Gold Award is the highest award a Girl Scout can earn. I can qualify for earning my Gold Award by giving back to the community and initiating a long-term project that will last
- Volunteers would be considered team members, but some team members must be experts in the area the girl is working in. If possible, I would like to list some of the Education Advisors of Sunrise as Team Members, as the job you will do will be a huge help and advancing the project.

What's the Problem?

They're expensive- and the price is only going up

Elementary School Uniform Policies

Banyan's Uniform:

- Polo shirts, Jackets/Sweaters- White, Royal Blue, Navy Blue, Light Blue, Gray
- Pants, Shorts, Skirts- Khaki, Navy Blue
- (Shoes/sneakers must be close toed and not backless. Jackets/Sweaters cannot have hoodies. School logo not required.)

Discovery's Uniform:

- Docker style pants/shorts/skorts/jumpers- Black or Khaki
- Polo shirts- Turquoise, White, Gray, Black
- (Limit socks and accessories to school colors.)

Horizon's Uniform:

- Polo, crew, or oxford shirts- solid White, Red, or Blue (any shade)
- Pants (Trouser or cargo style), shorts, skirts, skorts- Black, Navy, Khaki (MUST wear a belt unless elasticized)
- (closed toe and closed heeled shoes, sneakers preferred. No stretch pants allowed.)

Nob Hill's Uniform:

- Any combination of Navy, Light Blue, Khaki, White, and Yellow/Gold
- Solid color t-shirts, shirts with school logo, pants, shorts, skirts, capri pants, skorts, culottes, and jumpers allowed (in school colors only)
- (Sneakers required on PE days, backless shoes not allowed. Cardigans, sweatshirts, and jackets are allowed if in school colors.)

Elementary School Uniform Policies

Sandpiper's Uniform:

- Polo/Oxford shirts- Light Blue, Royal Blue, White, Red
- Crew Neck Shirts (REQUIRES SCHOOL LOGO)- Light Blue, Royal Blue, White, Red
- Pleated or Cargo shorts, pants, skirts- Khaki, Navy, Black
- Skorts and Jumpers- Khaki, Navy, Black, Light Blue/Gold Plaid
- (Navy outerwear preferred. Gym shorts must be wool/cotton and Navy.)

Sawgrass' Uniform:

- Polo shirts- Hunter Green, Red, White
- Any Sawgrass Elementary shirt sold is part of the uniform
- (no requirement for pants or shorts. Shoes must be closed toe and have a back.)

Village's Uniform:

- Polo shirts- Red, White, Black
- Bottoms and dresses- Black, Khaki

Welleby's Uniform:

- Polo shirts, jackets, sweatshirts, sweaters- Navy Blue, Light Blue, White
- Pants, shorts, skirts, skorts, culottes, jumpers, overalls- Khaki, Navy Blue
- (closed toed athletic shoes and sneakers at all times required)

Middle School Uniform Policies



Bair's Uniform:

- Polo Shirts, Sweatshirts and Jackets- SOLID Orange, White, Royal Blue
- Docker style pants, shorts, skirts- Black and Khaki
- (no hoodies, shoes must be closed toe and closed heel shoes ONLY. Spirit Fridays encourages students to wear their grade level colored shirt.)

Westpine's Uniform:

- Collared shirt- Burgundy, White, Gray, Black
- Cotton Twill or Denim pants, shorts, skirts- Khaki, Navy, Black
- (Westpine club shirts are allowed. Blue jeans are also acceptable.)

Charter School

- Franklin Academy:
 - All students are required to wear a polo shirt and navy bottoms with the school's logo
 - Uniforms must be purchased from iUniforms, the only approved vendor by the school
 - K-5th grade
 - Polo shirts- Light Yellow/Blue
 - All bottoms, including shorts, pants, and skirts, must be Navy. Can wear a Navy jumper (must wear a Peter Pan Collared Blouse underneath) or a plaid skirt.
 - 6th-8th grade
 - Polo shirts- Navy, white
 - All bottoms, including shorts, pants, and skirts, must be Navy

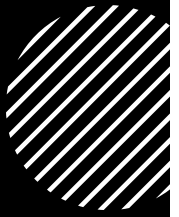
