Subject's Behavior

I was conducting surveillance at Walgreens Liquors in reference to an increase in thefts from the business. BSO Communications advised of an in-progress theft at 2901 North University Drive (Home Depot). I responded to the business and observed the offender leaving the parking lot in a silver sedan. I conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle based on reasonable suspicion that a theft had just-occurred. The front passenger bailed out of the vehicle and a foot chase ensued. During the chase, I yelled for him to stop running and that I was going to Tase him. The suspect failed to listen to my lawful commands to stop running and was subsequently tased for his active resistance. He was then handcuffed by Officer [redacted] and taken back to the traffic stop location where he was evaluated by Sunrise FD.

The subject advised he was not injured as a result of the tasing. Officers [redacted] and [redacted] accompanied him to the hospital for medical clearance. He was medically cleared and later transported to BSO Main Jail for processing.

The subject was ultimately arrested for two (2) misdemeanors.

The incident was captured on my department issued body-worn camera.

At 1453 hours on 06/24/2024, Home Depot Loss Prevention Agent (LPA) A. Dawson contacted the Broward Sheriff's Office Regional Communications Center in reference to an in-progress theft at 2901 North University Drive in the City of Sunrise (Home Depot-East).

According to B.S.O. Dispatch, a black male picked up power tools in the Garden area (south side) of the Home Depot. He was wearing a white hoodie and black jogger pants. I responded to assist Patrol Officers and approached the business from the south side garden area. As I arrived, I observed LPA Dawson on the phone (presumably with BSO Communications). He noticed my police vehicle and began pointing at a silver Nissan 4D vehicle (FL Temporary Tag DQT9005) as it left the parking lot.

I rolled down my window and LPA Dawson advised the two occupants were the ones who stole from the business. I maintained a constant visual of the vehicle and attempted a traffic stop at 2100 North University Drive in the City of Sunrise. The vehicle came to a stop in the parking lot of the YouFit gym (2101 North University Drive, Sunrise FL).

Through the un-tinted windows, I could see the front passenger pointing to another entry / exit way in the parking lot, as if he was telling the driver to flee in that direction. The vehicle was only occupied by two black males. Realizing they may try fleeing the traffic stop, I positioned by vehicle with lights and sirens activated in a way to prevent the driver from being able to exit that portion of the parking lot. The driver was also unable to exit the vehicle due to my vehicle positioning.

The front passenger immediately fled from the vehicle and ran into the YouFit parking lot. I exited my vehicle and called out a description of the suspect as he fled. The suspect was described as a tall black male, with a black head wrap, black joggers with a red line down the side, and black t-shirt. The suspect fled south along the rear of the Mobil gas station. Sunrise Officer [REDACTED] approached from that southern direction which caused the suspect to turn around and flee northbound on foot. Now that he was running toward my direction, I engaged in a foot pursuit with the suspect. I chased the suspect through the Mobil gas station and gave loud verbal commands to stop running or he would be Tased. I deployed my department-issued Taser and successfully incapacitated the suspect as he hopped over a set of hedges. The suspect was then placed under arrest by Officer [REDACTED] and escorted back to the police car. Sunrise Fire Rescue was dispatched to evaluate the suspect. The suspect was now identified as Owen Chance (B/M, DOB: 01/20/1991).

Owen should have known I was a Police Officer due to my police lights and siren that were activated when I conducted the initial traffic stop. I was wearing my Detective "Class E" uniform, which is a black polo shirt with name and badge stitched into it. I was wearing beige tactical pants and a black tactical vest with "Police" clearly visible on it. I was also equipped with badge, gun, and other police related equipment. Owen willfully and unlawfully defied my lawful commands to stop running, thus resisting my efforts to detain him during the foot chase. After being detained in handcuffs, Owen stated he was scared when the police (presumably me) "jumped out" on him. He denied being involved in the theft during these spontaneous utterances.

In summary, the vehicle Owen occupied was believed to be involved in a theft from Home Depot. Owen resisted

and obstructed me as I attempted to conduct an investigation into a theft he was allegedly involved in. At the time, I was engaged in the execution of my legal duties as a law enforcement officer. At the time, I was legally authorized to execute this investigation and Owen knew I was an officer. Owen was placed under arrest for resisting law enforcement without violence.

Owen was transported to Westside Regional Medical Center by Sunrise Fire Rescue for a medical clearance. He was accompanied by Sunrise Officers [redacted] and [redacted]. See their supplemental report for further information.

Officer [redacted] responded back to the Home Depot and transported LPA Dawson to the Mobil for a sworn taped statement and witness show-up. Detective [redacted] and I completed the sworn taped statement with LPA Dawson. In summary, LPA Dawson advised a six-foot tall black male subject with black sweat pants with a red stripe, a white hoodie with cartoons on it, and flip flops entered the store. The male selected multiple items and placed them into a Home Depot shopping cart. The male exited the store while passing all points of sale and making no attempt to pay for the selected merchandise. LPA Dawson confronted the male outside the Garden section of the store and recovered the stolen merchandise. The male then entered the front passenger seat of the silver Nissan while telling the driver to drive away. LPA Dawson identified a white hoodie with cartoons on it in the vehicle as being the one worn by the suspect during the theft. LPA Dawson was then escorted to the Sunrise Police vehicle and identified the detained male as the driver of the Nissan but not the individual who committed the theft. The driver was identified as Gregory Caldwell (B/M, DOB: 08/18/1992). Gregory did not contribute to the theft. He did not enter the store or help load the stolen merchandise into the vehicle.

Due to Gregory's limited involvement as just the getaway driver, and without information linking him to the theft, he was trespassed indefinitely from Home Depot and released from the scene with his vehicle. Officer [redacted] completed the trespass documentation for Gregory.

I then drove LPA Dawson to Westside Regional Medical Center. LPA Dawson was explained the witness show-up procedures again and entered the emergency room where Owen was being treated. LPA Dawson positively identified Owen as the male subject who committed the theft from Home Depot. LPA Dawson spoke on behalf of Home Depot and desires prosecution for the theft. With the positive identification by LPA Dawson, Owen was now charged with petty theft for temporarily depriving Home Depot of its merchandise valued at \$526.00.

LPA Dawson expressed his desire to have Owen indefinitely trespassed from Home Depot for the theft. Officers [redacted] and [redacted] administered the indefinite trespass warning and documented it accordingly in an FIC.

According to a criminal history check, Owen has been arrested multiple times for theft, robbery, and resisting law enforcement. The theft charge was not enhanced to a felony because he did not have three (3) previous convictions.

For the Taser deployment, the Response to Resistance Report (RRR), Conductive Electronic Weapon (CEW) form, and Taser Issuance form were completed and submitted to my supervisors in accordance with agency policy and procedure.

LPA Dawson uploaded CCTV footage, a photo of the merchandise receipt, and a photo of the stolen and recovered merchandise to Evidence.com for preservation. A shoplifter apprehension report was not completed by Lawson because I completed the sworn taped statement with him on BWC. The witness show-up form was uploaded to Evidence.com for preservation.

LPA Dawson was then transported back to Home Depot by Detective Taylor. I completed the probable cause affidavit and provided it to Sunrise Officers [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who waited until Owen was medically cleared before they transported him to BSO Main Jail for processing.

I compiled the evidence and reports for this case and uploaded them to Evidence.com for preservation and to have the shared with the State Attorney's Office for review.

This case is CLEARED BY ARREST.

The specific questions and statements can be obtained from the uploaded body-worn camera footage and/or the transcribed statements obtained from this investigation. All statements listed above are summaries of what was said during the interviews and conversations with the involved parties.
