The City of Sunrise invites you to be Good and Green by conserving resources and practicing stewardship. A great way to do this is by adding butterfly-friendly plants to your landscape at home, work or school.

Why are butterflies important? Butterflies, like birds, bees and moths are pollinators that are critical for agriculture and our environment. Pollinators are important for plant reproduction. In fact, pollinators are responsible for one out of every three bites of food we eat!

**MILKWEED** 

Unfortunately, butterfly and other pollinator populations are in decline. In order to thrive, butterflies need nectar from flowering plants, as well as specific host plants for their larvae (eggs), chrysalis (cocoon) and hungry caterpillars. For example, monarch butterfly populations have been in severe decline and their caterpillars only eat milkweed leaves. Milkweed is a plant with pretty red, orange or white flowers.

YOU can make a difference by adding butterfly-friendly Florida native plants to your landscape at home, work or school. They'll give your landscape a pop of color – and they'll help your garden qualify as a National Wildlife Federation Certified Wildlife Habitat and be counted as a Broward County NatureScape.
